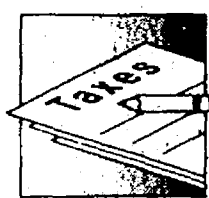

# Assessments increase slightly



Westland homeowners will see their smallest property assessment increase in years — 3.33 percent — this spring. The city assessor also expects a sharp drop in the number of assessment appeals to the city's board of review.

Westland residential property assessments are increasing just 3.33 percent in 1994 — the smallest jump in seven years excluding a statewide freeze in 1992. Westland assessor

Karen Hardin said Friday.

"I believe this is going to be very good news to people," she said.

Assessment notices are expected to be mailed to property owners by the middle of this week, Hardin said. Appeals will be heard next month.

The 3.33-percent increase is dramatically less than last year's 13 percent, which sparked a record 3,500 appeals, the assessor said. She is predicting far fewer appeals — perhaps 1,400 — in 1994.

Barring the 1992 freeze, this year's assessment increases are the lowest since a 2.6-percent hike was recorded in 1987, Hardin said.

Commercial and industrial assessment increases are typically lower than those for residential property, and that holds true this year, too, Hardin said.

Commercial assessments are climbing 2.38 percent for 1994, while industrial assessments are unchanged from last year, Hardin said.

"Residential properties sell much faster and at a higher rate," Hardin said, explaining why residential assessments typically rise faster than those for commercial and industrial properties.

Increases in housing prices have slowed in the last two years, which helps account for the smaller as-

# Robbery rash rocks retailers

Armed holdups at a Westland gas station, two convenience stores and a pizzeria are under investigation by Westland police, who believe the robberies are unrelated.

No shots were fired and no injuries reported in any of the holdups.

The latest incident occurred at 12:13 a.m. Thursday when a lone gun-

man wearing a ski mask walked into Dandy Oil on Ann Arbor Trail, near Merriman, and demanded money at gunpoint, said Westland Detective Sgt. Donald Haigh.

The gunman pointed a small handgun at a female clerk, who complied with his demands, Haigh said. The gunman fled on foot after taking an undisclosed sum of money, Haigh said.

Just 3½ hours earlier, two males, one carrying a gun, robbed the 7-Eleven store at Venoy and Cherry

tality this year — had undergone surgery and had been placed on a life-support system prior to her death, the officer said.

A semi-trailer slammed into the driver's side of Ankenbrandt's 1980 Mercury at 5:20 p.m. Wednesday when she lost control of her car while driving east on Warren, about a quarter-mile west of Newburgh, McIntosh said.

Ankenbrandt's car crossed the double-yellow line and skidded sideways into the path of the westbound truck, driven by a Kentucky man who didn't have time to avoid the accident, McIntosh said. The truck driver won't face any criminal charges, the officer said.

"He did slow down," McIntosh said, based on information provided by eyewitnesses.

Police are investigating why Ankenbrandt lost control of her car. She was alone at the time.

"We think she (started skidding) when she turned the wheel to try to get back into her lane," McIntosh said.

Her car spun around during the crash and came to rest beside a guard rail, the officer said.

Ankenbrandt's body was partially hanging out of the vehicle when officers arrived on the scene; she wasn't wearing a seat belt, McIntosh said.

Funeral arrangements weren't available as of Friday morning.

# City council approves more money for prisoner care

Capping weeks of discussion, the Westland City Council has approved a measure nearly tripling the amount of money it had earlier given the police department to jail prisoners.

The city will spend about \$294,000 for prisoner care for the fiscal year that ends June 30. The original budget approved by the council was only \$101,340.

Rising costs have been largely attributed to a crackdown on criminals — particularly repeat offenders — by police

and 18th District Court judges.

The council last week voted unanimously to boost the original budget by \$163,000. Coupled with an earlier \$30,000 amendment, money set aside for prisoner care has virtually tripled to \$294,000.

Costs have increased substantially in recent years, climbing from only \$113,763 in 1989-90. Simultaneously, 18th District judges have seen an increase in the criminal cases they hear, with 1,325 new felony cases being filed in the last three years for serious crimes such as robberies and rapes.

When police officials sought the budget amendment in January, some council members questioned the need for the threefold increase and asked for documentation. Subsequent reports provided by police and court officials have appar-

ently eased any concerns, judging by last week's unanimous vote.

Councilwoman Sandra Cicirelli — who earlier had questioned the increased costs — stressed last week that her concerns shouldn't be viewed as casting doubt on the police department.

"That was not the intent at all," she told police Chief Emery Price during the council session. "If that misunderstanding it out there, I certainly hope it is corrected."

The budget amendment was approved last week with little fanfare or discus-

sion, capping public discussions that began in mid-January.

Some of the \$193,000 in added expenses will be paid by shifting money to prisoner care from other police department expenses. For example, \$60,000 will come from decreased expenses in fringe benefits for police employees.

In an effort to cut prisoner-care expenses, Westland police are sending more and more jailed criminals to out-state facilities in Iosco, Hillsdale and Shiawassee counties — where costs are lower than in Wayne County.

assessment increases in residential properties, Hardin said.

Homeowners are expected to notice their property taxes decline by 40-45 percent this year because of school taxes that were slashed by state lawmakers, she said.

Michigan voters will decide a state ballot proposal on March 15 that will determine whether they want to replace school funding by raising the state sales tax or the income tax.

In a related development, the city has scheduled residential assessment appeals for March 10 from 1-8:30 p.m. and on March 11, 14 and 15 from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., Hardin said.

Commercial and industrial appeals will be heard March 8

and 9.

After receiving their assessment notices, residents seeking an appeal should phone 467-3160 for an appointment with the Board of Review, Hardin said. Residents can appeal based on financial hardship or if they believe their property is assessed too high, she said.

The Westland assessor's office has pamphlets to help property owners understand the appeals process. The pamphlets are available at the assessor's office, which is on the second floor of City Hall on Ford, between Wayne Road and Newburgh.

The appeals will be heard in City Hall's city council chambers, also on the second floor of City Hall.

## Man charged in assault with auto

A Wayne man has been charged with ramming a car into four people as he drove away from Westland's Rock-a-Way bar, where he had been involved in a fight, Westland police said.

Carl Wayne Boone, 22, was arraigned Thursday in Westland 18th District Court on four counts of assault with intent to do great bodily harm (less than murder), said Westland Detective Sgt. Donald Haigh.

The incident sent a 28-year-old Westland man to the University of Michigan Hospital, where he underwent at least two surgeries for leg injuries, Haigh has said. Three other people received lesser injuries, he said.

A not guilty plea was entered for Boone in 18th District Court last week. He is expected to be in court again this week for a preliminary examination to determine if he should stand trial on the charges.

He remained in jail at press time Friday in lieu of a \$50,000 cash bond, Haigh said.

The incident occurred at 2:05 a.m. Jan. 31 outside of the Rock-a-Way Cafe on Ford Road near Wildwood, on the Westland-Garden City boundary.

The incident began inside the bar when he became embroiled in a dispute with a female friend he had accompanied to the bar, Haigh had said earlier. He was subsequently ordered to leave the bar.

He also argued with other people, including a Rock-a-Way doorman who was among the injured, Haigh said.

The man, who had the keys to the woman's car, started it and drove over a concrete parking block, ramming into a small crowd of people and injuring four, Haigh said.

The victim who received the worst injuries was virtually pinned between the car and the building, Haigh said.

Hill, Haigh said. The robbers — one white and one black — escaped with an undisclosed sum of money.

Police also are continuing to investigate an armed robbery that occurred at 12:04 a.m. Feb. 19 at Hungry Howie's pizzeria, 1820 S. Newburgh.

A lone white male walked into the pizzeria carrying a semiautomatic pistol and demanded money from three employees, Haigh said. The man took money from the business and also robbed the workers of their personal money, Haigh said.

The robber has been described

as a heavysset, 5-foot 4-inch male who wore a black ski mask over the lower part of his face, the detective said.

Police also are continuing to investigate the 12:30 a.m. Feb. 18 robbery of the 7-Eleven at 172 S. John Hix, south of Cherry Hill. A lone white male escaped with an undisclosed sum of money after he walked into the store and used a black-steel automatic pistol to rob the store clerk, Haigh said.

The robber was described as a white male, 17 to 18 years old, about 5-foot-5 and weighing about 150 pounds.

## Teen could get life in prison for robbery that netted \$33

A Westland teen has pleaded guilty to a December robbery in which a 7-Eleven clerk was beaten with a steel pipe.

Charles Emory Gates, 19, faces sentencing March 15 after pleading guilty to an armed robbery that occurred at 1:49 a.m. Dec. 20 at the 7-Eleven on Hix Road, south of Cherry Hill.

Gates could face up to life in prison; he will be sentenced by Detroit Recorder's Judge Leonard Townsend.

Townsend's clerk confirmed Friday that Gates pleaded guilty Feb. 18 - the day that he had been scheduled for a final pretrial conference.

Garden City co-defendant

Shawn Michael Fischer, 21, is still facing a jury trial for armed robbery. His trial is set for April 19.

Westland police accused Gates of going into the 7-Eleven, assaulting the employee with a steel pipe and robbing the store of \$33.50. The pipe was 2 feet long and 1 inch wide, Westland Detective Sgt. Donald Haigh has said.

The employee was injured but survived the incident.

Although police have said Fischer didn't go into the store, he was charged with armed robbery amid allegations he accompanied Gates and waited outside in a getaway car.

Gates and Fischer were ordered to stand trial on the charges after they appeared in

Westland 18th District Court for a preliminary examination on Dec. 30.

Gates voluntarily waived his examination, in a move that automatically sent his case to Recorder's Court. Fischer tried to beat the charge by having testimony presented during his hearing, but he, too, was ordered to stand trial.

Westland police arrested Fischer after he initially went to the police department posing as a witness to the robbery. Police allege that he later made incriminating statements against himself and Gates.

Gates was subsequently arrested and identified in a photo lineup of suspects, Haigh has said.

## Man pleads guilty to assault

A Westland man accused of holding a knife to his ex-girlfriend's throat and threatening to kill her has pleaded guilty to attempted felonious assault.

Nathan Anderson Atkinson, 22, could face up to two years in prison when he is sentenced May 5 by Detroit Recorder's Judge M. John Shamo.

Atkinson had faced trial for felonious assault, which carries a maximum penalty of four years in prison upon conviction. But his guilty plea last week averted the trial.

He is free on bond pending his sentencing.

Atkinson was ordered to stand trial Feb. 3 when he appeared in Westland 18th District Court for a preliminary examination. He waived the hearing, in a decision that automatically sent his case to Recorder's Court.

The charge stemmed from an incident on the night of Jan. 22 in which his 24-year-old former girlfriend accused him of holding a knife to her throat and threatening to kill her.

The incident occurred about 11:20 p.m. inside the woman's residence in the 36600 block of

Palmer. The two formerly lived together, and they have two young children, police have said.

The woman reported to police that she and Atkinson had argued over her new boyfriend and that Atkinson became violent. She was not seriously injured, however.

Police reports indicated that the suspect told her, "I should kill you and then kill myself."

The woman managed to phone 9-1-1 for help during a lull in the dispute, police reports said. Atkinson then went outside of the house and sat in his car until police arrived.

# Proposal A

## Government groups have little enthusiasm

Only the Michigan Townships Association likes Proposal A, the school finance reform plan on the March 15 ballot.

The Michigan Municipal League, composed of 500 cities and villages, is opposed.

Neutral is the Michigan Association of School Boards and Michigan Association of Counties.

"MTA says everyone must play a part (in school reform). The townships will play a part by accepting a cap on assessments," MTA staffer Pat McAvooy told the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

She referred to Proposal A's 5-percent cap on growth in assessments, which actually will mean a smaller percentage growth in revenue, because business and farm property values haven't increased as fast as residential property.

"We're willing to take that cut

in revenue to support school finance reform," McAvooy said.

"Proposal A provides guarantees that (new sales-tax) revenues will go into the school aid fund," McAvooy said, citing the MTA board's primary reason for endorsing the plan.

"School (property) taxes (under A) can't be increased without a three-fourths vote of the Legislature," she said, citing the second reason.

"For all the reasons MTA supported A, we opposed it," said John Niemala, lobbyist for the Michigan Municipal League. MML's statement said most municipalities would see service cuts "as local officials scramble to cope with reduced funds."

The assessment cap, Niemala said, "will require assessors to keep two sets of books — one with the assessed value and one with market value."

Niemala said Proposal A

would amend the state constitution by removing language clearly guaranteeing 15 percent of the current 4-percent sales tax to cities, villages and townships.

MML also opposes Proposal A because it would "nearly eliminate" tax increment financing to pay for local industrial, commercial and downtown economic development. Proposal A will halt cities' "revenue capture" of school property taxes.

The Michigan Association of Counties hasn't taken a position because "there are not enough data to tell the fiscal impact," said MAC lobbyist Ron Wilson.

Lowering school property taxes from 35 mills to 24 mills or less will mean fewer tax delinquencies, Wilson said, and that will cost many mid-sized counties \$250,000 a year in delinquency fees.

Linda Beers, lobbyist for the neutral Michigan Association of

School Boards, said Proposal A doesn't fully protect school revenue.

"I've removed 'guarantees' from my vocabulary," said Beers. "Only the sales tax is earmarked constitutionally. Other taxes are only statutorily earmarked."

She said school districts no longer will be able to sell bonds to finance technology, re-equipping, and remodeling of buildings. And she deplored the "bidding war" state politicians are waging for the support of interest groups.

MASB has taken no position on Proposal A, she said.

Beers added that income-tax revenues have grown 102 percent in 10 years while sales-tax revenues have gone up 82 percent. Proposal A would raise the sales tax to 6 percent and lower the income tax to 4.4 percent. If voters reject Proposal A, the income tax will rise to 6 percent.

## Marking time with real style

It's about time I devoted a column to that which passes all too quickly. Yes, time flies and if you measure time by the face of your Seiko or Timex, you may be a bit out of synch with the newest trends in timepieces. The Swiss are once again the premier watchmakers of the world and to discover the companies that are household names to Europeans and astute collectors, you need only a brief visit with Dion Zaniewski, master horologist.

Zaniewski pursues the science of time measurement at his shop, **Dion's World of Watches**, in the Crosswinds Mall, 4301 Orchard Lake, West Bloomfield.

What's the newest trend in watches? Believe it or not, quartz is out and mechanical (you wind it) is in. "There's a certain tradition, nostalgia in mechanical watches," says Zaniewski. "You can hear it ticking, can see it working."

Zaniewski wears a Krieger mechanical chronograph (\$3,000). It has what he calls a PhD, or certificate of accuracy, that attests to the superior quality of the instrument. It is also engraved with a serial number that identifies it as yours alone. Only the best Swiss companies offer this certification. They include Rolex, Chopard and Chronoswiss.

In praise of the mechanical watch, **Heldi Kamber of Bloomfield Village** has worn her distinctive manual-wind Cartier for the past 15 years. It still keeps perfect time, but she also secretly loves her daughter's bright-faced Swatch.

### Tres chic

The most expensive watch that Zaniewski has sold in his shop was a handmade limited-edition Swiss Chopard (\$35,000). The company made only 50 and four came to the United States. "The watch took over a year to produce and encased 650 hand-crafted parts."

The Chopard collection includes an 18 karat rose gold skeleton-back beauty (\$4,500) and a lady's gold watch face surrounded by floating diamonds (\$16,750). The hottest new watches to hit the U.S. this year are the Hermes creations. The Medor is a covered fashion watch distinguished by its raised gold pyramids (\$1,100).

This Hermes signature began as a dog collar, evolved into a belt design and can now adorn your wrist.

The Kelly watch by Hermes is a replica of the famous Grace Kelly handbag with the characteristic padlock attached (\$850-\$900).

### Sports watches

Sports watches are another skyrocketing market and the European leader is Sector. They sponsor No Limits athletes, those extremists who endeavor the world's most challenging feats. These rugged timepieces are Swiss made of Italian design and, according to Zaniewski, are the best value for your dollar (\$198-\$1,695).

Another one-of-a-kind watch design is that of Alain Silberstein, architect turned watchmaker. The industry loves his signature squiggly second hand and triangle-shaped hour hand. His limited-edition professional diver's watch (\$6,500) is available at Dion's, one of only 100 in the U.S. Finally, my favorite, the vintage-look Chronoswiss rimmed in etched silver with hand-cut steel hands and a leather band. It has a classic turn-of-the-century dial (\$4,950). But Americans still love Rolex, the best mass-produced watch on the market.

**Leon Landsberg** and his wife of Farmington Hills, both own Rolex and trust them to no one but Dion. "Dion's the greatest. He's honest and saves you money," gushed Landsberg.

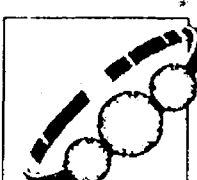
When it's time to replace that Rolex, look to Chopard, Breguet, Vacheron Constantin, Piquet, the most respected names in Europe and the pride of Switzerland, the Land of Time.

## Bridal consultants can make a difference

According to the Association of Bridal Consultants based in New Milford, Conn., a recent survey by Brides Magazine revealed that 87 percent of American brides knew about the services of professional bridal consultants, but only 7 percent used them.

Gerard Monaghan, president of the ABC, expects that figure will grow because brides and their mothers, the traditional wedding planners, now work outside the home and don't have the time it takes to listen to 16 bands, visit several florists to compare prices, or consult with dozens of bakeries about cake designs and deliver, dates.

Doris Carter of Livonia recently became a professional bridal consultant after years of working at the Golden Rings Wedding Chapel in Plymouth. She said brides should consider working with a bridal consultant for three reasons — a bridal pro can save a family time, money and aggravation.

"We do all the legwork after learning the bride's preferences and budget," Carter said. "We run around so she doesn't have to."

"Next, we can get discounts on flowers, bands, photographers, etc. because we bring these vendors repeat business."

"Finally, we know the vendors. We've done the research on their qualifications and dependability."

Carter said a bridal consultant will coordinate the entire wedding for a couple and arrive early the day of the wedding to make sure everyone does what he's supposed to do when he's supposed to do it. The bride and her family stay free of worry and responsibility to enjoy the day and their guests.

Her price? Ten to 15 percent of the total cost of the wedding. Carter refused to discuss the "average cost of

a wedding," pointing out that it all depends on the size, the tastes of the bride, and the kind of reception planned. "Some cost \$2,000, others can go as high as \$100,000," she said.

"It's important the bride have the kind of wedding she wants for the money she has to spend," Carter said.

"I respect the gal who knows what she wants before she comes to see me. She's looked at a few bridal books, read a few articles on etiquette. Knows her flowers. Last year, one gal I worked with had her bridesmaids attired in the sharpest black suits."

# Kroger's, teachers fill stomachs, hearts

Nancy Spinelle knows her kindergartners at Tyler Elementary School in Livonia need a little help learning. She knows learning's tough to do on an empty stomach.

Spinelle, a Westland resident, is on the Livonia teachers' union's board of directors, handling community relations efforts. She and her fellow educators were concerned about students who come to school hungry.

Those concerns led to a commendable effort, the Food To Share program. Union members work with Kroger staffers to provide food vouchers for needy families.

"We see kids come in, and they're not always getting food that's beneficial to them. If kids come to school hungry and don't receive proper nutrition, absolutely they aren't able to learn," she said.

The Livonia program is operated with the assistance of St. Edith's, Holy Cross Lutheran and Ward Presbyterian churches. The program's been under way for about a year, and already \$5,000 has been raised to help feed the hungry.

The idea's a simple one, and a good one. And it has spread to the Plymouth-Canton community, where more than 20 churches are working to have it in place by the spring, and to Farmington, where members of the Farmington teachers union are getting involved.

Educators, church members, store officials and others willing to get involved are to be commended for their efforts. It's all too easy to overlook the needs of the "working poor" in our communities, to pretend they don't exist or don't need our care and compassion. Food To Share partnerships help to overcome that perception and put food on tables where it's needed.

Kind-hearted shoppers at the grocery stores spend a certain amount over their own grocery bill, keeping the receipts for tax purposes. Kroger takes care of the accounting work; based on what's contributed the previous month, that amount is made available to needy residents the following month.

"I read a newspaper article last fall about a program going in Livonia," said the Rev. Bryan Smith of Canton, pastor of Geneva Presbyterian Church in Canton. He contacted Spinelle and talked to her to get some ideas on how such a program could be set up in Canton and Plymouth.

Many churches, including Smith's, operate food banks. Geneva members alone distribute 30 bags of groceries each month. The problem is those facilities aren't able to provide fresh produce, meat and dairy products, which

require refrigeration.

There's the question of dignity, too, organizers agree. Spinelle heard about one woman who was brought to tears and said, "What you've done for me is brought back my independence."

"That really made me feel great," Spinelle said. "We thought, 'Yes, it's working.'"

All the money raised has gone back into the program. Spinelle doesn't expect the Livonia program will come to an end — "as long as Kroger is willing to work with us, and they've been wonderful."

Help isn't limited to those with children in school or to members of certain churches, she emphasized.

The Livonia program began with the store at Eight Mile and Farmington

roads and was expanded to include the other Kroger store at Five Mile near Merriman. The Plymouth-Canton program will include the store at Sheldon and Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth Township and on Sheldon north of Ford in Canton.

In Plymouth-Canton, the local Salvation Army will serve as a clearinghouse, making sure the help only goes to the truly needy. The three Livonia churches, which operate year-round food banks, provide a similar service, according to Spinelle. Vouchers given to the needy can't be redeemed for cigarettes or alcohol.

"We do want to be sure the money is being spent for food," said Tom Chrzanowski, president of the Farmington teachers union. He's pleased to see his union getting involved.

March 21 is the anticipated kickoff date in the Farmington community, said Chrzanowski, a math teacher at East Middle School in the Farmington district. Shoppers would begin to contribute on that date; following some time for accounting work, money would be made available to the needy.

Two Farmington district teachers, Rose Galvin and Dan Schneider, are coordinating the efforts at two Farmington-area Kroger stores, on Middle-

belt just south of 11 Mile and on 12 Mile just west of Halsted. Each teacher is working with managers at each store.

Farmington teachers union members will depend on a local social service agency, perhaps Neighborhood House, to provide screening of eligible families and individuals.

Neighborhood House has a food pantry and can serve as a clearinghouse for the Food To Share program in the Farmington community, Chrzanowski said.

The Farmington district's southeastern corner has some lower-income residents who need such help, he said. Needy families are something of which local educators are aware.

Spinelle's heard the teachers' union in the Redford Union district is beginning to organize a Food To Share effort.

All those individuals and organizations concerned about the health and well-being of their communities are to be commended for getting involved.

Perhaps this first-rate idea will spread to neighboring communities and to other organizations.

## Private vs. public schools: Playing field differs

**QUESTION:** We are considering taking our son out of public high school and putting him in a private, denominational school. He skips school and his study habits are poor even though his test scores are high. He is in trouble with his teachers and the principal all the time. I don't think the public school is doing the job with my son. Also, I've heard that private school teachers are more dedicated than public school teachers.

**ANSWER:** The private schools, such as Catholic Central, Lutheran West (and others), offer students an excellent education; no doubt about it. I know, I attended Catholic schools as a child.

The private, denominational school setting is safer, has fewer discipline problems and has many outstanding teachers. However, if we are going to compare the private and the public educational systems, let's determine if we are on a level playing field.

Let's start with something simple, a dress code, and look at the differences.

**Private School Dress Code:** Adolescents entering a private denominational school are handed a list of require-

ments, including the acceptable (not recommended) dress code. Ron Horwath, a teacher for years in a private Catholic high school before ending up a principal in Northville, says, "We told the students that being properly dressed makes them ready for the world of work. If they didn't dress properly, after a few warnings, we sent them back to the public school. No lawsuits... a done deal."

**Public School Dress Code:** Public school administrators fought the dress code battle for decades — an unbelievable amount of time and taxpayer's money was spent on lawsuits. It was taking too much time from what a public school administrator is supposed to be: an educational leader, not a surrogate parent. What is proper dress in the public schools is now open for discussion and for consultation with the adolescent and generally handled quietly to avoid court cases.

So from the very get-go, those entering the private school setting are literally told what they will wear before even getting into a class. And there is an old saying: Set the standard early, enforce the little issues and the big ones won't even arise.

I personally believe in a reasonable dress code, especially in this day and age of youth gangs. I also believe teachers, who are now being paid professional wages, should dress as a professional and set the tone. A few teachers I knew wouldn't be let in a restaurant dressed the way they come to school, and some are excellent teachers. But, hey, I guess I'm just old fashioned. I still consider teaching a professional occupation.

**Student Behavior:** As far as acceptable student behavior goes, the private schools have a great edge. Private schools are wonderful for those adolescents who are border line problems (possibly like your son) and can document thousands of success stories.

However, those adolescents with severe behavioral problems are dumped right back on the public schools. Not that private schools don't care, but they don't have the money or resources (special ed) to deal with certain children. So it's simply not a level playing field when one compares private and public education.

Private schools generally select those students who have good grades and good test scores. They then set the rules, enforce the rules and send back those who don't wish to take advantage of the opportunity. Public educators set the rules, and then are told what they can and will do by lawyers and the courts.

Consider just one issue: Locker checks (for drugs, knives). At one time it was ruled public school administrators couldn't check lockers for drugs, knives and guns; this infringed upon a student's constitutional rights, his/her privacy. Do you think a private school principal cares what lawyers or the ACLU think? It simply is not a level playing field.

All this withstanding, if we set up a public vs. a private school olympics,

the event being who are the brightest and the best put-together adolescents, it would be a draw.

Public education's top 20 percent students, in quality school districts, are as bright or brighter as any private school's product. And keep in mind, the private schools deal with the top 20 percent of the student population, while public education handles the other 80 percent, those who don't qualify for a private school setting.

As far as private school teachers being much more dedicated to teaching than public school teachers, I must have missed the boat. As a central office administrator, I continuously received telephone calls or letters from people who wanted me to help their wife, son or daughter who were presently teaching in a private school get a job in a public school setting. The obvious reason being the much better fringe and retirement benefits, a powerful teacher's contract and a salary sometimes triple what they could make in the private school setting. I guess money talks.

I suggest you keep a seat warm for your son in his present public school.

# Area Jews organize new congregation

Wendy Sadler, Amy Rose and Debra Beck are pretty certain there's a group of people in western Wayne County that want to feel connected and part of a larger family.

"I would look to see who didn't have Christmas tree lights up," said Sadler of Canton Township. "We knew there had to be other Jewish people out there — unconnected. We wanted to start connecting with these Jewish families."

The three women and their families are among approximately 15 families — including persons from Garden City and Westland — who learned of each other and got together to form Congregation Bet Chaverim.

"We're going to work with the needs of the people. A lot of the people have no where to go. My family is out of state," said Rose.

The families got together about six months ago. Sadler is a teacher at Stepping Stones, Southfield, which is an educational program for intermarried families who have been unaffiliated with Judaism. Beck's daughter, Sarah, attends the program.

"She came home and said, 'Guess what, mom, there's another Jewish person in Canton,'" Beck said. Rose's daughter, Rachel also attends the program.

And that was the beginning. The families meet once a month on a Friday for Shabbas or Sabbath services, rotating between each other's houses. They also meet usually on a Saturday once a month for social activities.

"It's almost like a co-op mentality. Everything we do is potluck. We rotate so everyone is a host and leads the services," Sadler said.

Rose, Beck and Sadler each speak of feeling unconnected before meeting each other. "I started looking (for other Jewish families) because of what is called the December Dilemma," Beck said, adding her son is the only Jewish boy in his class, which celebrates Christmas in one form or another.

The three families didn't want to live or belong to a congregation in Oakland County or Ann Arbor. Besides not being able to afford living there, they want to form their own community where they enjoy liv-

ing — western Wayne County.

"We want to let people know we are out here," Sadler said, encouraging other Jewish families and intermarried Jewish families to join the group. "It isn't a prerequisite (to be intermarried) or a criterion to join in. It just happens to be case for many of us. Spouses who are not Jewish also participate. We try to make them comfortable."

Anyone who is interested in joining the other families to continue forming the congregation should call Sadler on her beeper number, 630-8950.

"Besides religion, everyone gets along. We all enjoy each other," Rose said.

The families are getting ready for Passover during which they will have a Seder on March 27. The families will meet Saturday, March 12, to plan activities and conclude with a Havdallah, or closing of the Sabbath.

The congregation as yet has no temple — they follow Reformed Judaism — or a rabbi. So far, the congregation has formed a board of directors and is drafting by-laws.

Probably the next step is Hebrew school for their children, particularly those approaching the age (13) for the bat mitzvah (for girls) and bar mitzvah (for boys). "We have a group of kids who need a Jewish education," Sadler said. "Anyone who can

read Hebrew can teach Hebrew. That's really the only criterion."

The families are also happy

that their children get along so well. "It is wonderful to see the total interaction of all these kids."

That is a good symbol — the warmth, the generosity," Sadler said.

# Bills give police more tools to fight domestic violence

A suburban prosecutor praised a package of legislative bills aimed at curbing domestic violence but objected to strong police reporting requirements in one bill.

"Law enforcement is difficult because you have to wait for actual violence," Livingston County's David Morse told the Senate Judiciary Committee last week. "This (injunction procedure in one bill) allows us to head off violence."

But Morse objected that requiring police to give the domestic violence victim a copy of the report immediately "may inhibit the officer at the scene. You should al-

low 24 hours."

Morse also disliked the length of the required police report and the sanctions against police officers and departments who fail to write them and make them available.

But Sen. John Kelly, D-Grosse Pointe, said it's a good idea to require police to issue the victim an immediate report. "The husband can't just wait for the police officer to leave so he can finish what he started. It's helpful (to the vic-

tim, usually a woman) to have that piece of paper," Kelly told Morse.

## 'Not trying to duck'

Backing Morse was Ingham Prosecutor Don Martin, who objected to bills ordering prosecutors to prosecute for contempt those who violate court orders.

"It's not that we're trying to duck our duties. But if we're required to prosecute for criminal contempt, it may result in double

jeopardy," Martin said. He said prosecutors should be given the choice of which offense to prosecute.

Sen. William VanRegenmorter, R-Jenison, said his panel would take up the bills again March 1 and possibly report them to the Senate floor.

Purposes of the bills are to give law enforcement more tools to fight, and victims more power to seek relief from, domestic violence. A key technique is to re-

quire police and prosecutors to treat complaints more seriously.

For example, a bill by Rep. Shirley Johnson, R-Royal Oak, requires police agencies to establish a "preferred or pro-arrest" policy. A bill by Rep. Barbara Dobb, R-Union Lake, provides for court orders to prohibit threats in cases of domestic violence. A bill by Rep. Maxine Berman, D-Southfield, sets up an exception for the "spousal communication

privilege," allowing a wife to testify against her husband.

## Shelters abused

A former Detroit policeman, however, raised a cry against the abuse of domestic violence procedures in divorce cases.

## Gang bill draws fire

A bill to make gang membership a felony is drawing fire from both conservatives and liberals on a House committee, where it raises the specter of "guilt by association."

"This would penalize membership in a gang," said sponsor Ilona Varga, D-Detroit. "They take pictures of themselves with automatic weapons and rifles. They document their activities, so it's easy for police to prove they're gang members. Police have pictures of them in uniform."

Varga's bill would penalize those who belong to and recruit for a "criminal organization," defined as one where "members commit crimes as a purpose of that organization."

"What bothers me," said Rep. Michael Nye, R-Litchfield, "is how to avoid labeling other organizations — for example, groups who lay down in front of a bulldozer to stop a nuclear landfill or a dump."

"I'm a Methodist. A Methodist bishop demonstrated against a power plant. I've put money in (the collection plate) every Sunday. That makes me an associate," said Nye, Republican co-chairman of the House Judiciary Committee.

Rep. David Gubow, D-Huntington Woods, was worried about defining a gang. "None of these groups files articles of incorporation or holds receptions in the Capitol and gives lapel pins," he said.

Rep. Nelson Saunders, D-Detroit, asked, "How do you prove that committing crime is a purpose of the organization?" Saunders raised the specter of "guilt by association" and the name of the late J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Rep. Lynn Rivers, D-Ann Arbor, said a basic premise of law is that one is responsible for his own crimes, "but here you could be prosecuted for simply associating. What if a mother associates with her son who is a member of a gang?"

After counting speeches, Judiciary chairman Tom Mathieu, D-Grand Rapids, announced, "We don't have the votes to put it (the bill) out today (report it to the floor). I urge the sponsor to work with representatives who raised these concerns."

Supporting Varga's bill was the Michigan Interfaith Council on Alcohol Problems (MICAP). "We're disturbed," said the Rev. Allen B. Rice, executive director. "They (gangs) are drug-related and youth-related."

"Gang violence hits every school district in the state," added MICAP's education director, the Rev. Tod Clark. "Members of the Latin Kings from Pontiac went to the north part of the state with a 9 mm pistol to 'take care' of some people his gang leaders didn't like very well."

Clark, who has spoken to student groups across the state, urged lawmakers not to worry about definitions "because the body count is too high."

Under Varga's bill:

■ Being a gang member is a misdemeanor punishable by 90 days in jail and a \$100 fine.

■ Committing a misdemeanor to "further the unlawful goals of the criminal organization" is worth a year in jail and a \$500 fine — on top of any sentence for the misdemeanor itself.

■ Committing a felony to further gang goals is worth four years in prison and a \$2,500 fine on top of a sentence for the felony.

## 'AMERICAN CONNOISSEUR' WINS GOURMET GAMBLE

Blasting his stereo got Todd Rones more than he bargained for - an opportunity to own and operate his own restaurant - American Connoisseur in West Bloomfield.

The restaurant is just part of the suburban success story of Birmingham entrepreneurs Peter Gikas and Dave Zilko who launched the American Connoisseur line of gourmet marinades, salad dressings, vinaigrettes and dessert toppings two years ago with no food experience and a \$2,500 credit card loan. In 1993 they doubled their sales, introduced five new products, and opened their first restaurant with the help of Rones who is the owner and operator.

"The first time I met Dave

he complained my stereo was too loud," said Rones, 23. "Todd and I were living next door to each other," explained Zilko.

Once the stereo issue was resolved, the neighbors learned they had much in common. Both are graduates of Michigan State University, and share a passion for food.

"He told me about the marinades and I thought they were very high quality," said Rones a transplanted Manhattanite who recently earned a degree in hotel and restaurant management.

"I sent a box of the marinades to my mother Rona in New York. She was impressed and said I shouldn't pass up this opportunity."

On July 20, Rones' dream of

## RECIPE MAKE OVER

SPINACH PIE



### Original Recipe

6 eggs  
2 packages (10 ounces each) frozen chopped spinach  
1 bunch green onions, finely chopped  
1/4 cup oil  
1 cup cottage cheese  
3/4 pound feta cheese, crumbled  
1/2 pound butter, melted  
12 sheets phyllo dough, defrosted

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Butter bottom of 9 by 13-inch pan. Fold each sheet of phyllo dough in half. Place six sheets of phyllo dough in pan, buttering between each sheet. Cook spinach according to package directions. Drain and squeeze all excess liquid from spinach. Mix first six ingredients in a bowl. Place this mixture on top of phyllo dough in pan. Place remaining six sheets of dough on top of mixture, buttering between each layer. Brush remaining butter on top of dough. Bake for 20-25 minutes uncovered. Cover with foil and continue baking for 35 minutes. Serves 8.

### Reduced-Fat Recipe

~Eggbeaters egg substitute equal to six eggs  
2 packages (10 ounces each) frozen chopped spinach  
1 bunch green onions, chopped

owning his own restaurant came true when Zilko and Gikas made him a partner in the carry-out restaurant which showcases the American Connoisseur product line. The West Bloomfield restaurant at 4301 Orchard Lake Road in the Crosswinds Mall features salads, gourmet marinated hamburgers, char-broiled and rotisserie chicken. Eventually the partners hope to offer franchises.

"American Connoisseur is the only restaurant I know of to be designed around an existing line of gourmet food products," said Zilko.

The story of American Connoisseur begins in January 1992 when the company was started by Birmingham based commercial real estate brokers Peter Gikas, an attorney, and Dave Zilko, who has a master of business administration degree in marketing.

"We studied the gourmet food market and looked for niches where products weren't available," said Zilko. "We both like to

cook, but had no food industry background. We wanted to make something that tasted great with powerful flavor, and didn't compromise on ingredients."

"We wanted to make it very tasty, and high quality. We found a niche for ourselves," adds Gikas.

They spent four months in their respective kitchens in Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills in the fall of 1991 developing their gourmet marinades. "We'd get together four to six nights a week," said Zilko. "We mixed the products up ourselves."

Six months after they were introduced, these marinades, now manufactured at a commissary in Sylvan Lake, were featured in Bloomingdale's, Marshall Field's, Macy's, Hudson's, Jacobson's, Woodward and Lothrop, Wanamaker's and Kaufmans.

Last spring, American Connoisseur became one of the few food companies to be featured on the upscale home shopping network,

### ANCHOVY BUTTER

2 sticks butter or margarine, cut into pieces  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
½ teaspoon fresh ground black pepper  
1 (2 ounce) can anchovies, drained

Using a food processor or a blender, add all the ingredients and process until smooth. Will keep tightly covered in the refrigerator for up to 1 week. Makes 1½ cups.

pretzels that she can make with her two kids, Kara, 5 and Kevin, 8.

This a recipe for a soft and chewy pretzel that can be twisted into a traditional shape or simply baked in circles or sticks for great eating.

### SOFT PRETZELS

1 cup warm water (105-115 degrees F.)  
1 package active dry yeast  
About 3 cups sifted all purpose flour, divided  
2 tablespoons soft butter or margarine  
½ teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1 egg, (optional)

Combine in a mixer bowl the warm water and the yeast. When dissolved, add and beat 1½ cups flour, butter, salt and sugar. Mix for three minutes.

Pour onto a board and knead in remaining flour in small quantities just until the dough loses its stickiness. Allow to rise in a covered bowl until doubled in bulk, about 1½ hours. Punch down and divide into 12 pieces for pretzels or 36 strips for sticks.

With the palms of your hands, roll into lengths about the thickness of a pencil. Twist and shape, if desired into pretzels. Preheat oven to 475 degrees.

Brush with a beaten egg and sprinkle with coarse salt, if desired. Bake until golden brown and crispy, about 12 minutes for pretzels and about 8 minutes for the sticks.

eries. Good Food Company also has a small restaurant that has an "amazing selection of prepared foods including soups, salads and entrees."

A few grocery items she regularly buys are non-fat fruit and fig bars, non-fat cereals such as Oatios, and Alta Dena, a non-fat European style yogurt. She also states convenience as being another plus of the Good Food Company. She can pick up groceries, vitamins and water in one store and have a great meal at the restaurant at the same time. This is a big plus for people who do not like to cook, eat out frequently, or do not like to cook for one person.

Hay asked for a "make over" of her spinach pie recipe. She was shocked to discover 46.4 grams of fat per serving were in the original recipe. By using a non-stick baking dish and cooking oil spray instead of butter, the total fat was

reduced by 170 grams. We eliminated the butter and cut 1,530 calories. Also, this recipe is best when made a day ahead. The cheese and spinach flavors blend together nicely.

Also, note that no cooking spray was used between the bottom layers of phyllo dough. The moisture from the spinach mixture provides the liquid needed to cook the dough.

I suggest making two pies at a time, baking one, and freezing one for future use. This recipe is wonderful to serve to guests. It is a very satisfying meal when served with a large garden salad.

AP — After studying long and hard to become a pedigree wine expert, Doug Frost has some advice for other people who would try it: Don't.

"It's impractical for most people to become wine experts," he said. "I'm here to tell you it costs a lot of money, money I didn't have. And it certainly takes a lot of time."

So how does the casual wine drinker make the right choices?  
Find a good retailer who knows your taste. When you get a wine you dislike, tell the retailer and

# Cookbook is for people with 'A Passion for Potatoes'

AP — Some potato recipes from Lydie Marshall's "A Passion for Potatoes," published by Harper Perennial.

## AN ELEGANT POTATO SALAD

- 1 1/2 pounds unpeeled small Red La Rouge, Ruby Crescent, Peruvian Blue, or Yukon Gold potatoes
- 1/2 cup white wine
- Salt
- Freshly ground pepper
- 1 teaspoon minced fresh tarragon
- 1 ounce (1 cup) dry morels
- 2 tablespoon butter or margarine
- 1 small head radicchio, cut into fine julienne (2 cups)
- 1 small fennel bulb, cut into fine julienne (2 cups)
- 4 1/2 ounces Gruyere cheese, cut into fine julienne (1 cup)
- 1/2 cup vinaigrette dressing (see recipe below)
- 4 cups watercress, stems removed
- 4 cups arugula, stems removed
- 1 tablespoon walnut oil
- 1 tablespoon vinegar

Pour about 1 inch of water in a large pan. Bring to a boil, fit the steamer into the pan, put in the potatoes, cover and steam for 15 to 20 minutes, depending on the size of the potatoes (Peruvian Blues will take longer to cook).

Peel the hot potatoes, and cut into 1/4-inch slices, or quarter them if they are very small. Pour the wine over them and sprinkle with salt, freshly ground pepper and tarragon. Meanwhile, soak the morels in 1 cup of water for half an hour. Drain through paper towels and reserve the liquid.

Quarter the morels only if they are more than 1 inch long. Heat 2 tablespoons butter and saute the morels for a minute, then gradually add the morel liquid over high heat and boil it down until 2 or 3 tablespoons remain. Season with salt and pepper and toss morels and the reduced liquid with the potatoes.

Stack the leaves of the radicchio and roll up like a cigarette. Cut

crosswise into very thin strips. You should have about 2 cups.

Toss the radicchio, fennel and cheese into the potato salad and mix in the vinaigrette dressing. Taste and add more salt and pepper if necessary.

Decorate each plate with watercress and arugula, sprinkle oil and vinegar over the greens, and fill the center with potato salad. Serves 10.

## VINAIGRETTE DRESSING

- 1 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground pepper
- 1 teaspoon prepared Dijon-style mustard
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
- 1/4 cup olive or sunflower oil

2 tablespoon walnut oil

Place salt and pepper in a mixing bowl. Add the mustard and mix in the vinegar. Add the oils and whisk vigorously. Taste and correct seasoning. Makes 1/2 cup.

## GARLIC MASHED POTATOES WITH OLIVE OIL

- 2 pounds russet or Yukon Gold potatoes
- 8 large unpeeled garlic cloves
- 1 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil

Cover the potatoes and garlic cloves with cold, salted water. Bring to a boil, partially cover, and cook

for 30 minutes, or until tender.

Drain the potatoes and garlic. Boil the potato water and reduce to 1 cup.

Peel the potatoes and the garlic. Mash them in the cooking pot with a potato masher, a ricer, or through a strainer. Turn on the heat and whisk in enough potato water to bring the potatoes to a thick, creamy consistency. Season with salt and freshly ground pepper.

Heat the olive oil. At the table, pour 1 tablespoon of hot oil on each portion. Serves 4.

## NEW POTATOES BRAISED WITH THYME

- 1/4 cup virgin olive oil

- 1 1/2 pounds Red La Soda or La Rouge potatoes, quartered
- 1 sprig fresh thyme
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground pepper

Heat the olive oil in a large non-stick skillet and stir-fry the potatoes for 8 minutes, shaking the pan once in a while to prevent scorching. Add the thyme and season with salt and freshly ground pepper. Cover and cook for 20 minutes over low heat, checking once in a while and letting the water gathered on the underside of the lid fall back into the potatoes.

Uncover, raise the heat, and brown the potatoes, shaking the pan. Serve right away. Serves 2.

## Produce pointers

Here are some answers to your produce questions from the Produce Marketing Association.

How can I speed up the ripening of my kiwifruit?

Kiwifruit, like some other fruits, give off ethylene gas, which helps promote ripening. To speed the process, store unripe kiwifruit near other ethylene sources such as apples, bananas, citrus, pears, and avocados.

If, on the other hand, you do not want to speed up ripening, keep kiwifruit away from other ethylene-producing items.

How can I tell whether cantaloupes are ripe?

A ripe cantaloupe should have a distinct cantaloupe aroma. The blossom end should also give slightly to gentle pressure.

## SOY GOOD FOR YOU

When investigators tried to isolate the reason that Japanese women report fewer hot flashes and other menopausal symptoms than American women, their research began to center on the soybean. 





# Baker leads way to better bread

If you want to make better bread, Daniel Leader will show you the way. A professional baker, Leader stresses good ingredients, simple recipes and a careful eye on the temperature. His guidebook is "Bread Alone," which contains 64 recipes for breads, quick breads and rolls.

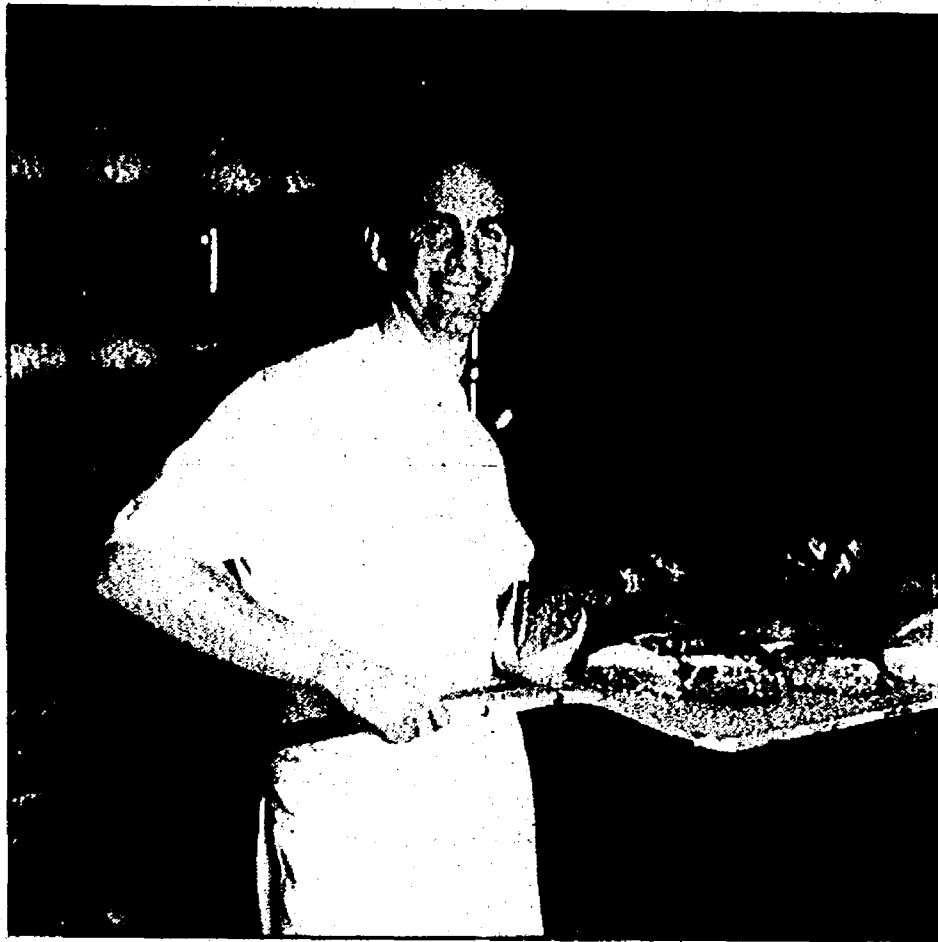
"Bread Alone" by Daniel Leader and Judith Blahnik is published by William Morrow & Co. The 8-by-10-inch hardcover book costs \$25. It has 332 glossy pages, including 24 pages of color photos.

Tops on Leader's list are using good organic flours, spring water and a couple of thermometers: He believes in long, relatively cool risings.

Leader is a baker in upstate New York who specializes in traditional breads — hearty breads with lots of wheaty flavor. Leader is so authentic he even has two wood-fired ovens. His book contains a chapter on recommended flours and suggested sources. It also has a chapter devoted to equipment and suggested sources.

The recipes range from a great basic bread (just flour, water, yeast and salt) to a pain au levain that must be started four days before baking. Along the way, Leader includes recipes for classic French baguettes, sourdough loaves and hearty peasant breads.

The book also lists quick breads, but Leader's heart clearly is in the making of high-quality

yeast breads. Although he is a knead-it-by-hand kind of a guy, Leader does offer advice on both mixing machines (thumbs up) and bread-making machines (thumbs down).

The large book's 24 pages of color photographs are handy: They show what the loaves

should look like. Because many of the breads begin with a kind of starter called a poolish, a poolish is shown in several stages of development: The poolish starts out thick, but it will get thinner as it ages up to 10 hours.

The photos also show the many types of loaves you can use in ad-

dition to the standard pan loaf: round, log, torpedo, baguette, fantasy, crescent, braided, etc.

Each recipe is up to three pages long. They aren't that complex recipes, it's just that each recipe is thoroughly explained. A lot is repeated from recipe to recipe, but this means you don't have to keep turning back to a master recipe.

Because breads made without preservatives will go stale faster than factory-made bread, Leader includes a note on how to freeze bread and then thaw it so that it retains as much flavor as possible.

So far I've made three of the breads by the methods listed in this book. They were good, even though I substituted Detroit water and bleached flour. Tomorrow I'll head over to Zerbo's to pick up some fresh unbleached flour. Then maybe I'll buy a jug of spring water and a thermometer to take the dough's temperature.

Bread Alone is available at Border's Book Store, 13 Mile and Southfield Road, Beverly Hills, and Border's Book Store in the Novi Town Center.

*I made a pepper and cilantro loaf from a recipe in this book and took it to a soup luncheon with other editors and writers. "Great bread" they said as they completely devoured my rustic-looking loaf.*

## Country-style loaf crisp and chewy

This is a large, rustic loaf with a golden rugged crust that is both crisp and chewy. This bread is much like the peasant breads of 17th-century France and Italy. Makes two loaves.

### POOLISH

½ cup spring water (75 degrees)  
½ package dry yeast  
¾ cup flour\*  
25% organic whole wheat and 75% organic white

The water should be at room temperature, around 75 degrees F. Combine the water and yeast in a medium bowl. Let stand 1 minute, then stir with a wooden spoon until yeast is dissolved. Add the flour. Stir until the consistency of a thick batter. Stir for another 100 strokes. Scrape down the side of the bowl with a rubber spatula. Cover with a damp towel or plastic wrap. Place in a moderately warm (74-80 degrees) draft-free place until mixture

is bubbly and has increased in volume (2 to 10 hours).

### FINAL DOUGH

2½ cups spring water  
½ package dry yeast  
1 Tbsp salt  
5¼-6¼ cups flour\*  
25% organic whole wheat and 75% organic white

Scrape the poolish into a 6-quart bowl. Add the water and yeast. Break up the poolish well with a wooden spoon and stir until it loosens. Add 1 cup flour and stir until well combined. Add the salt. Add only enough of the remaining flour to make a thick mass that is difficult to stir. Turn out onto a well-floured 2-foot-square work surface. Gradually add the remaining flour as you knead the dough vigorously for 15-17 minutes. Do not shorten the kneading time. The dough is well kneaded when you pull a little dough from the mass and it springs back quickly. Shape the dough into a ball and let it rest on a lightly floured surface while you scrape,

clean and lightly oil the large bowl. Place two tablespoons of vegetable oil in the bowl. Place the dough in the bowl and turn the dough to coat the top with oil. Cover with a damp towel and place in a moderate draft-free place until doubled in volume. The dough has risen enough when a finger pressed ½ inch into the dough leaves an indentation. Deflate the dough by pushing down in the center and pulling up on the sides. Turn out onto board and knead briefly. Form again into a ball, return to the bowl and cover with plastic wrap or a damp towel. Let rest in a moderate draft-free place for 30 minutes. Deflate the dough, transfer to a lightly floured work surface and knead briefly. Cut into two equal pieces. Flatten. Shape each piece into a tight ball. Cover and let it rest 10 minutes. Flatten into a disk 1 inch thick. Fold the top edge down about one-third of the disk and seal firmly. Fold from the top a second time and seal firmly. Fold in half lengthwise and seal firmly, pinching the seam closed. Put in greased pans. Cover

with a damp towel or plastic wrap and put in a moderate draft-free place until the dough rises until it just reaches the rim of the pan. Do not let it overrise or "dome." Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F. Put the pans in the center of the oven and quickly spray the inner walls and floor of the oven with cold water from a spritzer bottle. Avoid spraying an electric light bulb in the oven. Spray for several seconds until steam has filled the oven. Quickly close the door to trap the steam and bake 3 minutes. Spray again in the same way, closing the door immediately so that steam doesn't escape and bake until the loaves begin to color (about 20 minutes). Reduce heat to 400 degrees and bake until the loaves are a rich caramel color, another 15 to 20 minutes. Turn the loaves onto a rack and cool at least 20 minutes.

## Don't leave food on counter to defrost

"My mother still insists on defrosting her meat on the counter, how can I convince her that this isn't safe?"

This is a very commonly asked question on the Food and Nutrition Hotline, said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Michigan State University Extension, Oakland County office.

There is good reason to be concerned. Food should never be defrosted at room temperature because bacteria can multiply rapidly and may cause food poisoning. Some "old time" methods of food handling may no longer be safe.

Here are some tips for proper defrosting:

- Do not defrost food on the counter.
- Defrost food in the refrigerator.
- Provide a drip pan for meats, poultry and fish and catch juices which may contain bacteria.
- If you are in a hurry, defrost food in microwave — carefully follow directions given in microwave

handbook and then cook food immediately.

■ The cold water method of defrosting is also safe — immerse meat or poultry which is in water-proof wrap under cold water.

So, for those of you wondering what's new, here's a look at a few of those releases:



"Hearts and Bones and Voices," Pet Engine: The overriding theme on "Hearts and Bones and Voices" is being something that you're not. What Pet Engine is is a gold mine waiting to be discovered. Fans of Best Kissers in the World, The Posies or The Replacements will dig this Milwaukee band, formerly known as Blackfish. Matthew Schroeder's guitar assault drives the 10-song CD along with vocalist and fellow axman Stephen Ziel.

Lyrical, the quartet — which also includes bassist Clem Blanding and drummer Daniel Andera — isn't afraid to tell it like it is: "My knuckles bleed as I knock on the wood of the cross that you carry like a bulb that's planted. A bulb that never grew."

The album closes on a tender note with the acoustic ballad "Universe" during which Ziel is joined vocally by The Posies' Ken Stringfellow. Get this record and tell all your friends you had it before they were "big."

"The Emma Peel Sessions," The Pretty Green: The followup to "Panache" doesn't stray far from the Warren-based band's influences of British pop and pure American rhythm guitar rock.

The band doesn't waste time with flowery lyrics, instead opting to be honest and to the point. In "Virtue" lead singer Dave Goulette asks for relief from emotional pain: "Let's pray the world will end today or something that will make me feel OK." The four-song EP ends with a live recording of "It Stands to Reason."

The cassette version of "The Emma Peel Sessions" includes The Pretty Green's cover of the Goo Goo Dolls' "There You Are." Both live recordings are rough but it captures the essence of The Pretty Green's live show.

"Swollen" Yard-boss: Lead singer Marty Conselyea's choppy lyrical phrases sometimes makes it difficult to follow the lengthy songs. But his throaty growl on top of thundering guitars by Nick Sokolowski and Greg Savala and Rico Grazioli's powerful drumming carry this CD above others by local rockers. Bassist Todd Pocobello brings his musicianship to the forefront with the song "Sticks & Stones," the obvious hit on "Swollen."

"Drain-O," Mr. X: "Drain-O" is a highly underrated fast-rocking record by Mr. X, a.k.a. the Junk Monkeys' Lynn Scanlan, and his band Drain-O. Filled with more hooks than a fisherman's tackle box, "Drain-O" tears through 10 songs recorded at the Tempermill studios in Ferndale. It also features guests like The Exceptions' horns section ("Toledo"), and fellow Junk Monkeys David Bierman ("Pain") and "Hyper" and Dave Boutette ("Toledo"). A bonus track on the cassette is a live recording of "Suburban Life," a song by Mr. X's former band The Idiots.

Forehead Stew "Water"/"React": Forehead Stew calls itself a "disruptive rock band producing anti-social music of little value." There's plenty of value in this single, especially in the A-side "Water." Jeff Fowlkes' booming drums and Matt McGuire's hypnotic guitars kick off "Water" followed by Al Sutton's gut-wrenching, over-compressed vocals. With bass lines by Andy Sutton topping off the song, speed metal fans should rank Forehead Stew high on their priority list.

On the flipside, Al Sutton's vocals are so convincing that it's easy to feel his frustration in "React." "... I step out of line, but you push me back in place. Frustration and anger let me out. It's always the same. All the games they play. Let me out. Let me out."

Many bands in this genre, fall victim to hookless songs. However, Fore-

head Stew listeners will be helplessly drawn in with "Water" and "React," which was featured in John Freeman's snowboarding video "Demented Chowder Pilots."

"The Nothing Like Vaudeville Show" The Nothing Like Vaudeville Show: This 10-song concept album tells the story of a "strangely deformed boy" who runs away from home. The bumpy road, on which he is introduced to drugs and a short-lived love affair, eventually leads him to an evil Ringmaster's Freakshow where the child is one of the top attractions.

The song "Mr. Hyde" explicitly describes the boy's newfound friend: "Lurking in the shadows, don't need a disguise. Evil's in my blood. Evil's in my eyes. Step into my parlor; I'll take you for a ride. No, I'm not the doctor. Call me Mr. Hyde." His parents find their son and when confronted about his job he says, "The Ringmaster told me that God made me a Freak for everyone to enjoy."

Abrasive guitars and eerie keyboards lace "The Nothing Like Vaudeville Show," which is one of the few concept albums that works. "The Nothing Like Vaudeville Show" is also an appropriate vehicle for lead vocalist Michael Jones to prove he has a tremendously versatile voice. Imagine Pantera meeting The Who's "Tommy" and that's what "The Nothing Like Vaudeville Show" is all about.

"Bermuda Mohawk" Bermuda Mohawk: This five-song debut concentrates on the raw side of Bermuda Mohawk. Recorded primarily at PR Music in Detroit, the self-titled cassette intertwines the band's blues, country and rock influences with Sal D'Agnillo's raspy voice.

"Higher," Higher: The band's self-titled effort doesn't take rock to new heights. The six-song EP, however, does serve as an adequate introduction to the Rochester Hills-based band's bass heavy, straightforward rock'n'roll.

Although the lyrics are predominantly simple, the song "Rise" possibly offers insight into the quartet's outlook of their musical future: "We've got to rise (higher) one way or another." For starters, the band recorded at the prestigious Pearl Sound Studio in Canton Township, and is discussing future plans with LA record producers.

While it seems as if lead vocalist/guitarist Michael Alexander is uncomfortable in the recording studio, the glossy album has laid a nice foundation for future releases.

Each of the remaining three songs — "Blown," "What Is This," and "Alien Eyes" — brings the band a step closer to patenting its sound. "Electrip" is also one of the few recent studio products that is as electric as the band's live show.

# Sharing, talking helped answer son's questions

### Voice Mail Message:

This call is regarding the column on Playboy subscriptions for teenagers. I have a 17-year-old who goes to a private high school, makes straight A's, and is going to college next year. At 14, he expressed a similar interest and so I went out and bought "Playboy," "Penthouse" and "Hustler." Then I looked then over myself and went up to his room with them.

I showed him all of the magazines and what they had to offer ("Playboy" being the better option). We talked over the cartoons, the articles, the letters. I told him that the letters from "Hustler" clearly were not from real women; I told him that women would have to be psychotic to want to be hurt the way that these women said they wanted to be.

I pointed out that these were not pictures of real women; they were "perfect" — airbrushed, no blemishes or bruises. We talked about the importance of love and about sex and hormones. We talked for about two hours.

I gave him the magazines and told him he could share them with his friends, if he wished, as long as they were locked up (I have a younger son also). He is not allowed to have these magazines on a subscription basis. He may still look at them when I'm not around.

On his 16th birthday, I rented an X-rated movie, "Deep Throat," the only one I'd ever seen. I told him about mechanical sex, loving sex and what marriage meant or should mean. I then left him to watch the movie alone. I think this is a private thing, and I didn't want him watching me for my reaction.

Then we discussed pornography again, and I let him know that he was not to watch these

movies in the house. After watching the movie he said that he became bored with it and felt he didn't have to sit through it a second time.

From the start, my husband supported me in all that I did. He was not, however, comfortable taking part in my talks with my son. I don't know if that's the best way to handle it. This might not be for everybody, but it's what worked for us.

Dear Caller,

Yours is the sixth response to the question of pornography for teenagers. What is so interesting is to see the wide range of different approaches to the same problem. We do not know everything yet to say this one is right or this one is wrong. As discussed in the reply to the original caller, what might be right for one family might be the wrong thing for another. What I have to applaud is the good intentions of the parents who put themselves out in order to help their children solve a problem in their growth and development.

Also, I was impressed by the husband and wife working together for the benefit of the children rather than being at odds with one another.

I would like to use my response to your letter as an opportunity to thank all of my readers who are willing to share their experiences with others. I would think that there may be many readers who have opinions about the issues that are printed in this column, but who do not report them to us. May I sway you to overcome your reluctance and help us to learn from your experiences?

# Angel epic goes way of all sequels

Like most sequels, "Faraway, So Close" stretches a great idea way too thin. Stunningly photographed and engagingly acted, this story of angels in modern-day Berlin walks a fine line between poetry and pretentiousness.

You might say that German director Wim Wenders has earned the right to be so self-indulgent. Actually, he's been that way all along.

A major international director since the early 1980s, Wenders made his biggest splash with "Wings of Desire" in 1988. Bruno Ganz starred as an angel who longs for an earthly life with a beguiling trapeze artist.

Ganz appears in "Faraway, So Close" (playing at the AMC Woods after a recent run at the Detroit Film Theatre), but the focus here is on "Desire's" right hand man, Cassiel (Otto Sander). Leaning closer to a mortal so that he can hear better, the angel lis-

tens in not only on conversations but inner thoughts as well.

Usually, he's joined by fellow traveler Nastassja Kinski. Now sporting long blonde hair (remember her in Wenders' "Paris, Texas"?), she nurtures the troubled souls she watches over with a caring, often pained expression.

Black-and-white photography backs scenes in the angels' domain while ultra-bright colors accent the world of humans. Turning mortal so that he can save one of his charges, Cassiel has a bout with alcoholism before entering the lives of those he used to protect.

He also looks up old friend Ganz, a pizzeria owner still married to the trapeze artist. They have a beautiful daughter together, who has her father's angelic personality and her mother's passion for the high wire.

Wenders' films cleverly mix European sensibilities with stunning international casts. Aside from the welcomed return of Kinski, there's a great supporting role for Willem Dafoe as a cynical angel whose loyalties and motives remain clearly ambiguous.

You'll also find Lou Reed, Peter Falk and even Mikhail Gorbachev as themselves. Falk was hilarious and poignant in "Desire," given the superhuman ability to feel the presence of the angels. Here, he's simply along for a gag or two, including a misfire bit where he cons a pair of security guards who, like everyone else in Europe, are big "Columbo" fans.

Several different melodramas unroll at once in "Faraway, So Close," perhaps the most interesting of which involves a gangster/bootleg video exporter (Horst Buchholz) in search of his long-lost sister. They were separated as children during the last minutes of World War II.

Wenders also employs a modern-rock soundtrack, featuring U2's current hit "Stay" and a live performance by Reed. But even this device, a staple in all of the director's recent films, grows too self-consciously "hip" after while.

The movie, which runs almost 2½ hours, looks like it has been edited, though I'm not sure if it was too much or not enough. There are enough loose ends here to support two other movies, especially in the climactic scene aboard a barge loaded down with weapons.

At times an engaging meditation on the earthly and the ethereal, "Faraway, So Close" truly reflects the contrasts of its title.

really well because it's a lot less demanding to do a recurring role. I could work every weekend doing stand-up if I wanted to, but I'm competing on the indoor circuit this winter. I'm trying not to work that hard so I have more time to train.

"I've done this (riding) my whole life. I often say that I do the acting and the comedy to support my equestrian stuff. I'll be working for rent when I come to town (March 11-12 at Miss Kitty's Comedy Club in Oxford)."

Does she have an honest chance of making the U.S. equestrian team in two years? Her trainer has already qualified, and Stone is doing her best to follow suit. Regardless of the result, Stone appears to have matters in perspective.

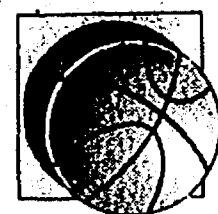

# Shamrocks win Catholic title

A going away present?

Bernie Holowicki still shrugs when asked if he'll return next year as the Redford Catholic Central boys basketball coach but if he doesn't, at least he'll have a Catholic League championship to remember his last year by.

The Shamrocks continued their glorious season with a surprisingly easy, 69-45 victory over Detroit St. Martin DePorres in the championship game Sunday at the University of Detroit-Mercy's Calihan Hall.

The win, which improved CC to 14-4 overall, was the first Catholic League title for the Shamrocks since 1989 and the seventh in Holowicki's

23 years at the school. Holowicki has never lost a Catholic League championship game.

"Winning never gets old," said Holowicki, 62, rumored to be in his last year as coach. "My theory is you win with good people and you lose with good people. We have real good people here and it makes it fun. They're just a bunch of blue-collar kids who work hard."

Although Holowicki has said it is up to CC whether he returns, athletic director Bob Santello said after the victory he had no comment about the issue.

The Shamrocks play Detroit Public School League champion Murray Wright in the Operation Friendship

game at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at Calihan Hall.

Of the five players who scored for CC, four are seniors. Senior guard Andy Slankster scored a career-high 24 points and had a game-high 10 rebounds, senior center Joe Daly had 16 points and eight rebounds and guard Anthony Hesano had 13 points.

Daly made six-of-seven shots from the field and the Shamrocks also were sparked by senior guard Andy Kummer's nine points and junior forward Mike Ridley's seven points and seven rebounds.

The Shamrocks have won seven games in a row.

"The whole thing this year is to 'make it a memory' — coach's 600th victory, the Catholic League championship," said Hesano, who had the hustle play of the day, crashing into the scorer's table for a loose ball in the fourth quarter. "Us five seniors knew what we had to do. We had a talk one day at practice, said 'playoff time,' is 'senior time.' We knew it was our 13 guys on our own. Kids at

school jumped on us (early) when we lost and then jumped on the bandwagon when we won."

DePorres, No. 1 ranked in Class C, made only 16-of-59 shots from the floor (27 percent) and was out-rebounded, 38-29.

DePorres, 16-2 overall, forced seven CC turnovers in the first quarter to lead 15-11 but a 13-0 run in the second quarter by the Shamrocks changed the momentum.

The Shamrocks committed only eight turnovers after the first quarter and led 28-21 at halftime and 44-33 after three quarters.

Slankster scored 10 points in the fourth quarter, including a put-back basket with 5:10 remaining to end a 6-0 run and give the Shamrocks a 54-37 lead.

Which prompts the obvious question: Where the heck were the favorites?

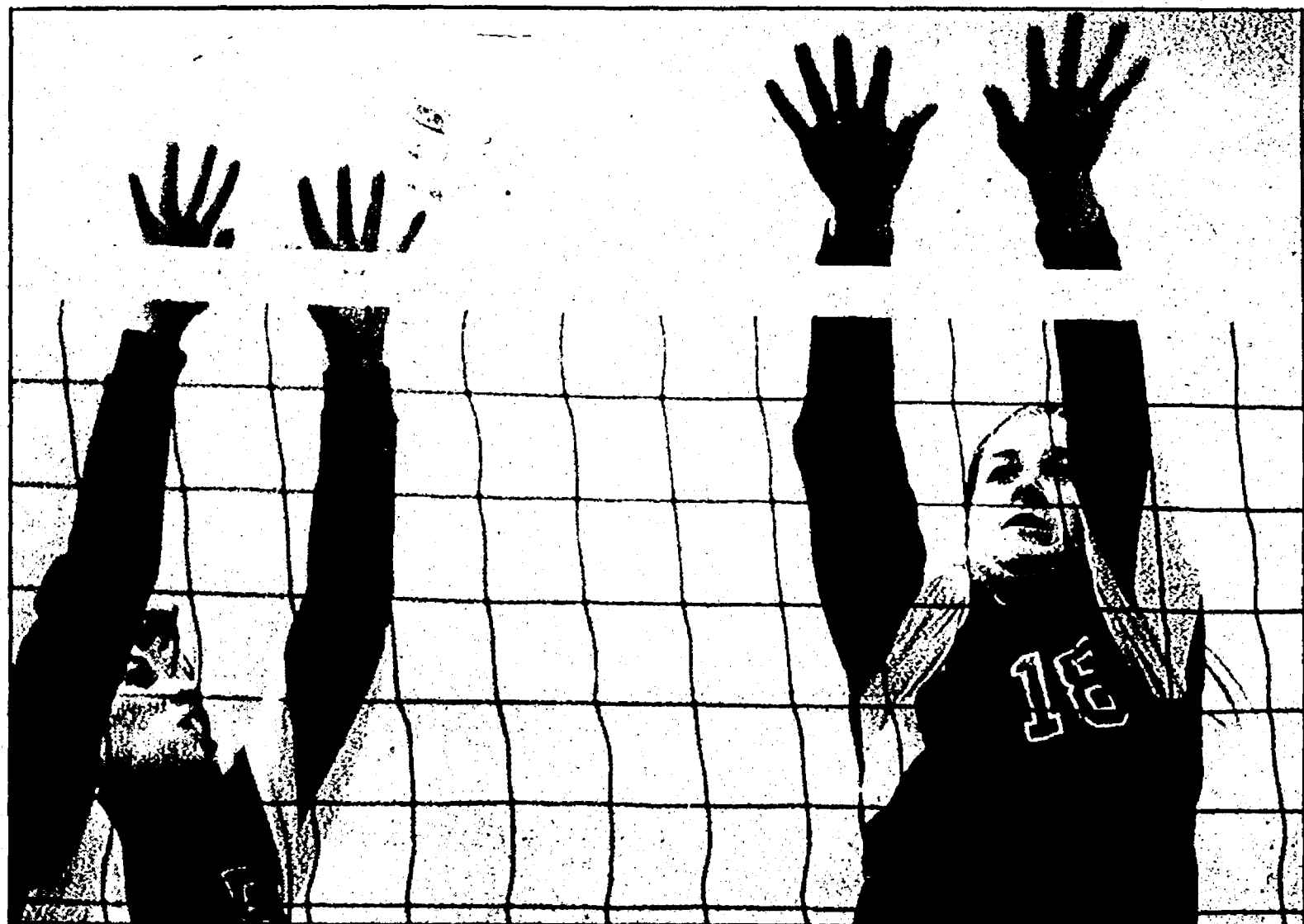
No. 1 seed Plymouth Salem, which breezed through the league season unbeaten through 11 matches, and No. 2 Walled Lake Central failed to survive pool play.

Stevenson had a young team, too, after losing its coach and starting lineup from the championship team of a year ago. But the Spartans advanced with a 4-2 pool record; beating both Plymouth Canton (15-11, 15-5) and North Farmington (15-7, 15-11) but losing to Churchill (15-13, 15-9).

They knocked off Northville in the quarterfinals (15-6, 15-7) and Franklin in the semis (15-12, 15-2) to set up the rematch with Churchill.

Churchill did, as Hughes noticed. Tradition played a part, to be sure; before Stevenson beat the Chargers last year, they had won five straight WLAA championships.

The difference this time, according to Hughes, was "we served tough, which makes it difficult for the other teams to get the ball to their big hitters."

Hughes had tinkered with his lineup throughout the season, one reason for Churchill's 7-4 conference record and No. 3 seeding in the tournament (Stevenson was No. 4).

"We had been playing very inconsistently," he said. "Just last week, we started playing more consistently. And we've been real tough on de-

fense."

Size is not a Charger attribute, but according to Hughes, "We have a very even volleyball team."

And they also have a strong setter in Amy Cousin. "She was absolutely outstanding today," he said. "We use a 5-1 lineup, which means she has to do all the setting, and I know she had to be exhausted."

Cousino finished with 70 assists to kills in the tournament. Sarah Fabirkiewicz led Churchill with 39 kills, including four against Stevenson in the final. Renee Tomlinson had five kills to lead the Chargers against Stevenson.

Candice Ribar led the Chargers' strong serving contingent, serving for 40 tournament points.
