## Athlete starts Olympian fund-raising

Westland's own Olympian hopes to make tracks to Belgium this summer.

Erika Benjamin, 29, is the world record holder in the 5,000-meter bike event in the Paralympic games and will attempt to improve her times if given the opportunity to compete.

"It won't be easy, but I would like to try," Benjamin said, who works as a dish washer for Douglas Food Co. in Garden City.

"I just found out we can go to Belgium, and I have to have \$2,000 by June to make the trip."

The U.S. Cerebral Palsy Athletic Association event in Belgium will serve as a qualifying event for the Paralympic games in Atlanta, Ga., in

1996. Athletes must turn in \$1,000 by next month and another \$1,000 before June to compete.

In the past, athletes have been given more advance notice of the competitions and therefore more time to gather funding. Benjamin, a John Glenn High School graduate, said the deadline for this event concerns her.

Benjamin trains almost every day on her bicycle. When weather allows, she can be seen riding through the city streets and she does her speed training on a local track. During the winter months she rides a stationary bike in her apartment.

She is coached by John Waterman. Benjamin has traveled to Florida, Holland and Barcelona for competitions. It was in Barcelona that she beat the world record in the 5,000

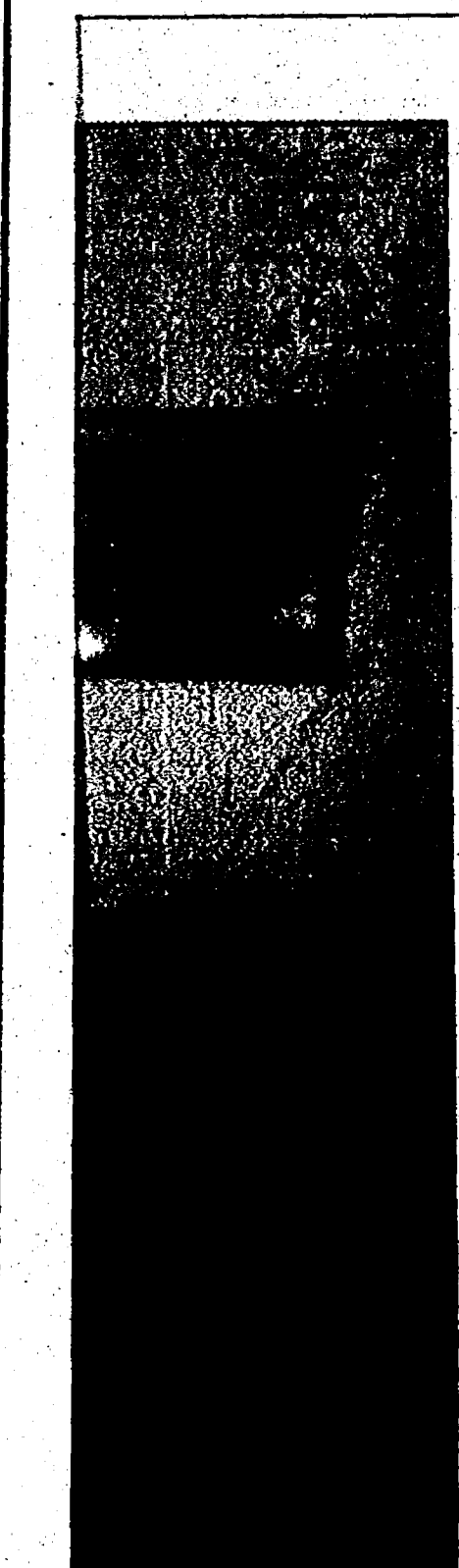
meter by more than 1 minute and took home the gold medal.

She was also named Athlete of the Year in 1993 by the U.S. Cerebral Palsy Athletic Association.

"People see us and think we are part of Special Olympics," Benjamin said. "They are for the mentally challenged, and I am physically challenged. Special Olympic athletes get support, but we don't."

Marlene Doran and the Westland Civitans have been supporting Benjamin's endeavors for several years. Doran said it will require a lot of work to gather the money needed for the Belgium trip.

## Compost season

Westland residents can start using the municipal public service department's compost and rubbish transfer services, starting next week. The city announced that the compost season will begin next Monday, April 4, and continue through December 2.

Compost must be clearly marked on cans or plastic trash bags and be placed at least 10 feet from conventional trash containers.

## PLACES & FACES

All brush and limbs must be tied in bundles of four-foot lengths and weigh no more than 50 pounds. No cardboard boxes will be picked up. The rubbish transfer station will open Friday, April 8, at the DPS yard, on Marquette, just east of Newburgh.

For larger vehicles, the fees are \$15 for small pickups or vans, \$22 for a standard pickup or 4x8 trailer, \$27 for 4x8 and 5x8 trailers, \$33 for 5x10 trailers, and \$45 for larger trailers. The station will be open 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Fridays and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturdays.

Car or truck tires won't be accepted. Conventional rubbish, household furniture and appliances will not be accepted at the transfer station. For information, contact the DPS at 728-1770.

Mentioned most frequently were "a safe home and family throughout the year," said Cash, whose agency is located in a former Wayne-Westland elementary school in the Cherry Hill-Middlebelt area.

She told her audience about several premature newborns, weighing only 1½ pounds each, who had no one to take them home.

The Safe Stay program, expected to start next month following state Department of Social Services approval, would provide a "safe and nurturing environment for children," she said.

The foster care services would be financially supported through the Michigan Department of Social Services. Users of the foster home and services would not be charged, Cash said.

The program would also allow parents or primary-caregiver grandparents to have the children tempo-

## After 26 years, the prosecution rests

His bar association membership card lists Howard Philippart Jr., but anyone who has even a nodding acquaintance with the veteran prosecutor knows him as Mickey.

Even certificates and awards hanging on his office wall are made

out to Mickey. It's a nickname bestowed on Philippart as a child by his father and used during his days as an amateur flyweight boxer fighting at Olympia during the 1940s.

A Redford Township resident, Philippart is retiring at the end of the month after 26 years as a Wayne County assistant prosecutor, the

"The Garden City community will miss having him as a resource to call on," said Garden City police chief David Kocis. "Mickey was a great guy just to talk with. He always had a great story and a smile. Some people are sour, but he's never

been that way."

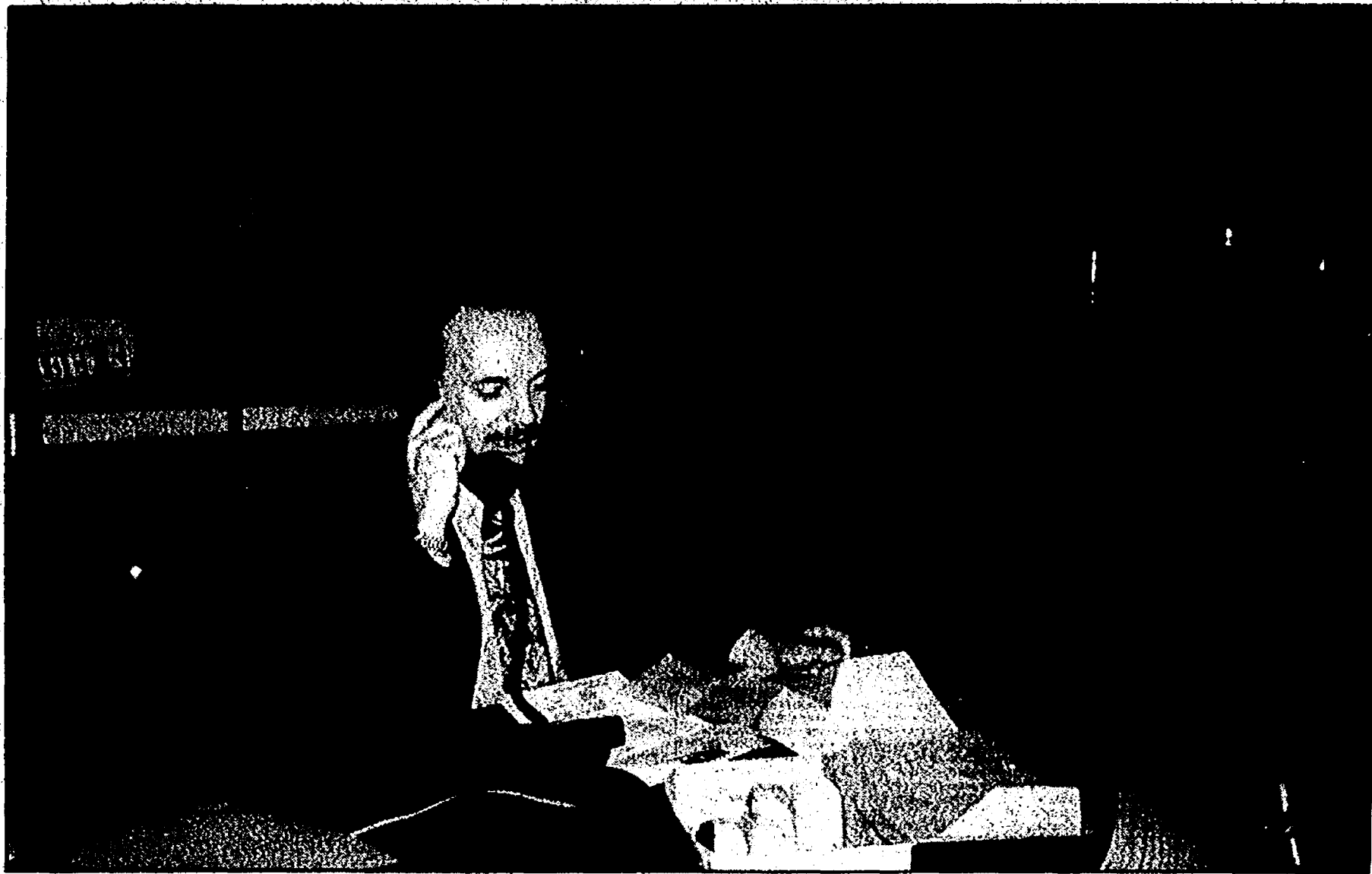

## Meeting tomorrow on status of old dump

A public informational meeting will be held Tuesday night to update residents on testing and cleanup plans for a former dump in Westland's northwest section.

It will be held by the county at 7 p.m. in Bailey Recreation Center, on Ford between Wayne Road and Newburgh, directly behind city hall.

It follows a similar public session held March 14 by the federal Environmental Protection Agency on the status of the former dump, north of Warren Road and west of Central City Parkway, adjacent to two apartment complexes. Those two meetings attracted a total of about 60 people.

Tuesday night's meeting will have representatives of the county's new department of environ-

ment and 3M Co., which admitted earlier this year that it dumped some industrial wastes in the dump which was used by that firm, the county and Crestwood Development Corp., which built the nearby apartment complexes, up through the early 1960s.

In announcing Tuesday's informational meeting, county spokeswoman Irma Clark said that "available historical information indicates that small amounts of industrial materials, perhaps less than 1 percent, were deposited with the municipal refuse prior to 1962."

While all tests conducted by the county have shown the site to be safe, the EPA has ordered test excavations and possible full-scale waste removal activities.

"Wayne County, Crestwood Development and 3M instead have fenced the site and have been conducting further testing of the air, water and soil, in addition to removing any exposed landfill materials," she said.

At one of the two March 14

EPA informational meetings, County Commissioner Kay Beard, D-Westland, disputed the federal government's comment that the county has been uncooperative in moving ahead with testing of the site.

## Man arraigned in March 6 holdup

A Brighton man was arraigned March 21 on armed robbery charges in connection with the March 6 robbery of the Dandy Oil-Marathon gas station on Ann Arbor Trail at Merriman.

Gregory James Krachenfels, 37, was brought to 18th District Court in Westland from Lapeer County, where he is awaiting trial on another armed robbery charge. He has also been charged with four armed robberies in Oakland County and is being investigated for others.

After entering a not-guilty plea on behalf of the defendant, Judge C. Charles Bokos set bond at \$100,000 cash security and Krachenfels was returned to the Lapeer County Jail.

While a not-guilty plea was automatically entered for him on the gas station robbery, Westland police Sgt. Donald Haigh said the defendant has the chance to change his plea when the case reaches Recorder's Court.

The Dandy Oil gas station was held up March 6 by a man wearing a ski mask, dark sweat pants and leather gloves claiming to have a gun. Two similar robberies were reported at the same gas station earlier in the year, but Krachenfels, who grew up in the Westland area, has not been linked to either of those.

If convicted, Krachenfels could face up to life in prison. A felony firearm charge could not be filed as no weapon was recovered.

## Man shot fleeing would-be robber

Westland police are investigating a shooting and attempted robbery involving a Wayne man and a hitchhiker.

Wayne resident Anthony Crider, 31, was shot in the face with a small-caliber weapon at about 7:45 p.m. March 16. He was treated and released March 17 from Henry Ford Hospital.

According to police reports, Crider was driving in the city of Wayne when he picked up a hitchhiker. At Inkster Road and Van Born, the hitchhiker reportedly attempted to rob Crider. To avoid the robbery, Crider started

to drive off and was shot.

Crider, according to police Sgt. Donald Haigh, drove himself home and then to Annapolis Hospital, Wayne. He was transferred to Henry Ford Hospital where he was interviewed by police officers.

He was released from the hospital early the next morning with the bullet still lodged in his jaw area.

Police say the shooter is an African-American, light-complected male in his 20s, about 5 feet 8 inches and between 160 and 170 pounds.

## Whale of fund-raiser Graham students sea way to save Keiko

How far will you go for a friend? It was the theme of the box office hit "Free Willy" and now thousands of fans from around the world are doing what they can to save the real-life Willy, Keiko, now in poor health at a Mexico City aquarium. P.D. Graham Elementary School fifth-graders have taken the cause to heart and hope to send a check for \$1,000 to help give the killer whale a future. Cindy Parmeter's class learned about the plight of the whale, and a Tampa, Fla., school's effort to save him, on a national news program. They started out writing letters back and forth

with the Tampa students and preparing a segment on the whale for the P.D. Graham "TeleGraham News" program that the fifth-graders produce on video.

"They wanted to do more," Parmeter said.

The teacher found a stuffed toy killer whale in a shop and discussed with her class the possibility of hosting a raffle to collect money for the effort to save Keiko.

"At first we set our goal at \$500 and we earned that in just two days," Parmeter said.

The goal was increased to \$800 and that was reached in time for the raffle. The district's teachers union agreed to chip in

\$100, and now the class is working to collect an extra \$100 in donations to bring their total contribution to \$1,000.

The students have been studying the plight of endangered species and class president, Brandi Hunt, said the information has helped her better understand the importance of protecting all animals.

"If they're going to be held captive, they should be treated better," Hunt said. "We're not going to stop until he's freed."

There is a plan in the works to save Keiko from an imminent death. A world-renowned marine biologist is working to locate the whale's family in Iceland waters and hopes to gradually re-release

Keiko into the wild. The effort will cost \$5 million and is still in jeopardy due to the perilous condition of the whale and an opposition campaign waged by some water parks.

Keiko's tank is too small, the water is too warm, he is underweight and suffers from a skin disorder as a result of an inefficient water filtration system in his tank.

Parmeter's class is now writing to makers of "Free Willy" which has netted more than \$100 million and making a plea to them to help with the effort. They also continue to correspond with the class in Tampa watching for updates on Keiko's condition.

## Murder trial starts Tuesday

The family members of slain Garden City resident Robert John are bracing themselves for the trial which they say might finally let them put their 25-year-old son to rest.

Jury selection is scheduled to start Tuesday in Detroit Recorder's Court in the second-degree murder trial of Robert Miguel, 42.

John, father of six minor children, was shot with a rifle the night of Aug. 21 in front of the Miguel residence on Wayne Road, just north of Ford, Westland.

Police said the two families had argued earlier.

Miguel's wife has told the Observer that her family was

under attack from the John family when the shooting occurred. The version from Tommy John, the victim's father, is that his family members had gone to the Miguel house to make peace.

Miguel is free on a \$60,000 bond.

The John family would feel better "if we get justice as it should be," said Polly John, the victim's mother. "Emotionally, it is still hard."

Polly John said she and her family have been seeking help to overcome depression since the death of Robert John. The victim's children are still having difficulty coping with the death of their father, she added.

It's been especially difficult, Polly John said, knowing that Miguel has been free on bond.

The Johns have been vocal in the proceedings leading up to the trial this week.

In January they made a formal request that the judge and the prosecutor assigned to the case withdraw because they said the criminal justice system was siding with the defendant. They were particularly upset when the trial date had been delayed from Jan. 24 to June 6.

After their complaints, Circuit Judge Paul Terranes and Wayne County Prosecutor Lisa Lindsey took over the case. The trial date was then changed to this week's date.

"We feel now that we are treated better, but we just want justice done," Polly John said.

The entire John family plans to attend the trial this week.

## Kids win praise in toddler rescue

Aaron Nason and Josh Walter went to Madison Elementary School Wednesday morning just like they do any other day, but by the end of the day they were heroes.

Nason and Walter, both fourth-graders, were preparing to return to their classroom after recess when they noticed a toddler standing in the middle of the road. The 2-year-old had managed to get out of the house on his own.

The two boys alerted their teacher and a rescue effort ensued.

The toddler was snatched from the street and returned home safely.

Nason, 10, shared the credit for the rescue with his friend,

Walter, who noticed the toddler first and started to shout to the teacher.

Nason was the focus of attention Friday when Madison principal H. Phillip Buerk gave each student a certificate for their quick thinking.

"You helped out a little guy who could have been in a lot of trouble and we're really proud of you," Buerk said.

Nason said he has a baby niece at home now and is ready to watch out for her, too.

"I know little ones can get in a lot of trouble," he said.

## Crash injures 2 John Glenn students

Two John Glenn High School students were treated for head injuries Friday after being involved in a two-car collision on Merriman at Rush, Garden City.

"If they had been wearing seatbelts they would have escaped injury and probably would not have had to go to the hospital," said traffic officer Mel Maier. "The accident caused both of them to strike the windshield."

The students, a 17-year-old

Inkster resident who was driving and a 16-year-old Westland resident who was a passenger, were heading north on Merriman when the accident occurred at 7:22 a.m.

The Inkster youth was making a left turn onto westbound Rush and pulled in front of an oncoming southbound car driven by a Livonia man.

"It was nearly a head-on collision. The southbound car had gone through a green light and was going about 40 miles per

hour," Maier said. "The (teen-age) driver went over the steering wheel and broke a piece of the windshield."

Both teenagers were transported to Garden City Hospital by the fire department's rescue unit, treated and released. Maier said the Livonia man, who was wearing a seatbelt, complained of head, neck and back pain but declined treatment.

The Inkster resident was ticketed for failing to yield to oncoming traffic.

# Howell closes book in Livonia

There'll be a new man in charge of the "nuts and bolts" of running the Livonia school district starting July 1.

After 30 years with the district, which includes the northern section of Westland, director of operations Art Howell will retire June 30.

His successor will be David Watson, assistant principal at Churchill High. The school board named Watson to the \$82,000-a-year post last Monday, March 21.

The operations director is in charge of all the behind-the-scenes functions that keep the district running.

This includes purchasing, warehouse operations, data processing, transportation, maintenance,

printing, food service and environmental control. It even includes deciding whether to close schools because of bad weather conditions.

"It's completely different than teaching, but you're still involved with teachers and kids," Howell said. "My job is keep the schools clean and safe."

Before his 18 years on the business side of education, Howell was a teacher at Johnson Elementary, an administrative intern at Coolidge Elementary, an assistant principal at Cleveland Elementary and a junior high assistant principal at then-Riley Junior High.

Since joining the central administrative staff, he's served as business administrator of building services, assistant director of

business services, assistant director of operational services and director of operational services as well as director of operations.

Howell plans to stay in the area and join a weekday golf league. He also plans to take classes in cooking and Spanish. His wife, Clare, still works for the district.

Howell has been a driving force in the building program now under way. Seeing school buildings upgraded has been the "best part" of his job, he said.

The "worst part," he said, is having to say no to parents who want their child bused to school for safety reasons but who live too close to a school to qualify for transportation.

One part of his job he won't miss, he said, is getting up at 3 a.m. during the winter to see if

snow conditions warrant the closing of schools.

Watson, a 1964 graduate of Livonia Bentley High, was named the district's outstanding young educator in 1975 by the Livonia Jaycees. He has a master's degree from the University of Michigan.

The biggest challenge Watson will face in his new job, Howell said, is "reprioritizing to keep the buildings in shape during a period of diminishing resources."

Watson said he plans to follow in Howell's footsteps in giving residents schools in which they can be proud.

"When I started here as a second grade teacher, (the district) was a great place to be and that continues today," Watson said. "I want people to continue to be proud of their schools."

rarily in the foster home for short periods during a time of family violence and crisis, Cash said.

The director cited a recent incident in which a grandmother called her agency in desperation.

The woman was caring for three of her grandchildren, ages 3, 5, and 7; was planning to undergo knee surgery; and was also caring for her cancer-stricken husband.

"I just need help for a week," the grandmother told Cash.

The foster home would provide that help for families who sometimes just need to have the children in another environment while adult caregivers work out their problems, she said.

"We want a program in which parents in crisis can come for help and early intervention," she said.

There would be no charge for the program, which will include medical and other services, Cash said.

Her agency is reluctant to contact DSS to care for the children because the state may place youngsters in a facility and not return them to their parents, she said.

Cash added that there is a major financial savings for newborns in a family in crisis.

The cost of caring for that infant at Hutzel Hospital and Children's Hospital in Detroit is \$1,600 daily, she said.

At the YLC's planned foster homes, the cost is projected at \$150 a day.

The organization has two foster homes, both in the Palmer-Newburgh area of Westland. One cur-

rently can handle up to eight children at a time.

Planning for the program was helped by a \$660,000 grant from the Skillman Foundation. Ongoing operational costs would be reimbursed by the state.

Cash said several local businesses have already contributed to the program, including quantities of diapers from the Westland Kmart and Dearborn Heights Target stores as well as help in decorating the children's bedrooms in the foster care program.

The home also has a guest bedroom to be occupied by a parent or relative who has to get away from a crisis environment at home, Cash said.

Under the program, a child would be allowed to stay in the foster care for a maximum of 30

days a year.

In a written description of the program, Cash said it is designed to provide "safe, temporary shelter and a broad range of services to children from birth through 10 at both at-home and center-based family support and preservation services."

The program is also geared to strengthen those families and provide them "time out" at times when the chances of abuse or neglect are greatest.

Cash said the need for crisis nurseries and respite care centers has been documented both nationally and in Wayne County.

## Hundreds protest drug lifer law

More than 400 people packed the Wayne Community Center Thursday to protest a state law that has put almost 200 people in prison for life without parole since 1979.

The prisoners were convicted of a 1978 law informally called the "650 Lifer Law." If the amount of cocaine or heroin seized in an arrest is 650 grams or more, the folks arrested can be charged with the Lifer Law.

Meant to put "drug kingpins" in prison for life, the law has been used to incarcerate minor players in the drug business, including cocaine couriers, and in many cases their unwitting accomplices. Of the 188 Michigan prisoners serving life sentences under the Lifer Law, 73 percent are first-time, non-violent offenders, said Dennis Louney, an aide to state Sen. William Faust, D-Westland.

The Senate Judiciary Commit-

tee is considering legislation that would modify the Lifer Law. One alternative, sponsored by Sen. Jack Welborn, R-Kalamazoo, gives lifers a chance for parole after 30 years. The other plan, sponsored by Faust, authorizes parole after 10 years. Furthermore, Faust's bill would be applied retroactively.

The 60 people who spoke at the public hearing Thursday, many of whom have friends or relatives in prison, clearly preferred Faust's plan.

Westland resident Linda Fannon, whose son Gary has been in prison since 1987, drew applause when she testified that "murderers, rapists and child molesters get paroled every day," but her son, a first-time offender, has no chance at parole. The law, Fannon said, "has failed miserably (and) has allowed blatant selective prosecution."

Rev. Robert Starkey of Port Huron noted that from 1979 to 1983 there were six convictions

under the Lifer Law. But in 1987 there were 14 convictions, followed by 24 in 1988 and 53 in 1989.

If all the people convicted under the Lifer Law were "drug kingpins," Starkey remarked, the Michigan drug problem ought to be licked by now.

Plymouth resident Ed Fisher called the Lifer Law "sick, sick, sick," adding that prosecutors use the law to score political points.

"Sick minds are using this mandatory sentencing to make names for themselves," he said.

Marty Reisig, a Birmingham attorney and former federal prosecutor, testified that the "pur-

suit of justice is destroyed when we have extremes of leniency or extremes of harshness." Reisig noted that folks convicted of Michigan's lifer law would have received far lighter sentences in federal court. "We've got something out of whack here," he said.

Jeffrey McCarty of Detroit said this to Sen. William Van Regenmorter, R-Jenison: "I can pull a gun out right now and shoot at you with the intent to kill and miss your heart by a millimeter, and I get a chance for parole."

The Lifer Law, McCarty said, "is inhumane, it's barbaric, it's animalistic."

## Upset parent arrested

Inkster police arrested a parent at Hicks Elementary School Wednesday afternoon when she demanded her child be released from school.

The woman said she was unhappy with the school and insisted her child be turned over, according to Carol Johnson, the district's director of elementary education.

"We have a procedure we follow

when parents want to take their children out of school and she did not follow that procedure," Johnson said.

When the parent went right into her child's classroom, disrupting activities, school personnel phoned Inkster police.

Officers tried to subdue the woman when she assaulted one of the officers. The woman was taken into custody.

"Guys will miss Mickey because he had a police-officer mentality; he wasn't strictly an attorney," said Garden City Detective Sgt. David Harvey. "Mickey knew where we were coming from, and what we were asking for. If you got turned down (on a warrant request) and at times you did, it was for a good reason."

Philippart would look at the whole case and what the officer was trying to accomplish with the warrant, Harvey said, adding that over the years he learned a lot about writing warrant requests.

"He'd help you use all your tools. The majority of times cases are solved by the patrol officer or not solved at all," Harvey said. "As the detective you have to take responsibility as officer in charge. Some attorneys use that to treat you like dirt. Mickey was not like that. He always treated you like a professional."

"I've been available and listened when people needed an ear. I like people," Philippart said. "The reason I like out-county is that it's like an old-time prosecutor. You get to know the judges and cops. I've had cases of dog fighting, one of cattle rustling, and a lot of domestic violence."

After attending Sacred Heart seminary and a brief stint in the Navy, Philippart decided to follow his father's career choice by becoming an attorney.

Asked where he attended law school, Philippart responds like any good Catholic school graduate. "There is only one law school — the University of Detroit."

Philippart was admitted to the bar in 1951, the same year his father died, and joined his father's firm in private practice. Philippart and his wife Elizabeth, who

had nine children, were married that year.

In 1968, two of the couple's children, boys 3 and 5, went with a neighbor to the zoo. While they were out, the neighbor decided to include the children in a flight of a small private plane. The plane developed a gas leak and exploded, killing in midair everyone but the pilot.

A short time later his friend, William Cahalan, then Wayne County prosecutor, asked him to join the prosecutor's staff.

"He said I was a sensible person and he needed me. I figured \$18,000 a year was good," Philippart said. "He and (current prosecutor) John O'Hair have both been good bosses."

Robert Sage, who was Philippart's boss at the out-county office until his retirement two years ago, said he was sorry Philippart was leaving so soon.

"He was my right arm. He handled a lot of sexual assault cases, heavier homicides and conspiracies," Sage said. "We called him Capt. Smut because was in charge of pornography cases."

Besides being a favorite of police officers, Sage said Philippart was also well liked by circuit court judges. "He knew how to keep the docket moving," he said. "He's a great guy. I suggested after 17 years in private practice he get on the right side and he took my advice. He's been an asset to the prosecutor's office."

One of the first things on the agenda for Philippart and his wife after his retirement, a trip to Alaska.

"I guess I get a little nostalgic. It's time to step down. They'll miss you for about a week," he said.

## Drug cases bound over

Two men were bound over on unrelated drug charges Thursday.

Reuben Vincente Perez of Westland was bound over on charges of possession with intent to deliver a controlled substance.

Perez was in 18th District Court Thursday for a preliminary examination on charges that he was found in possession of thendritmetrazine. He waived the exam and bond was continued and Perez was released until his

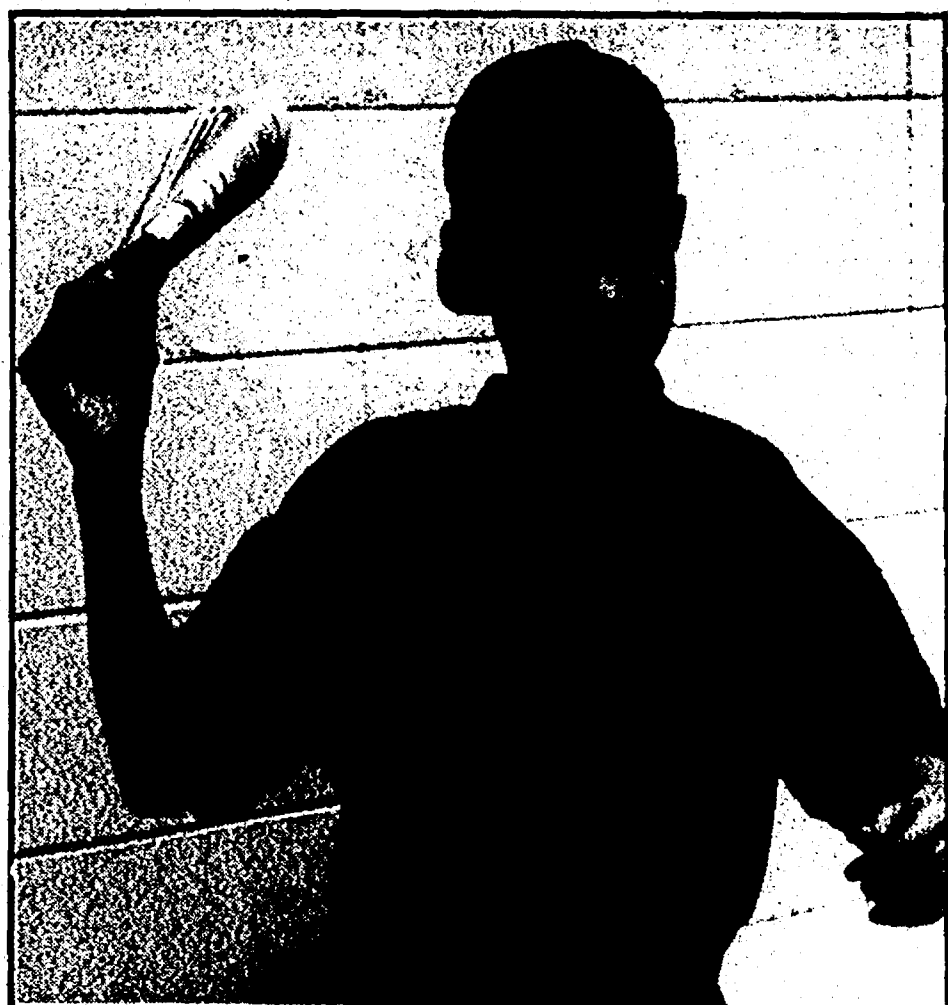
arraignment in Recorder's Court.

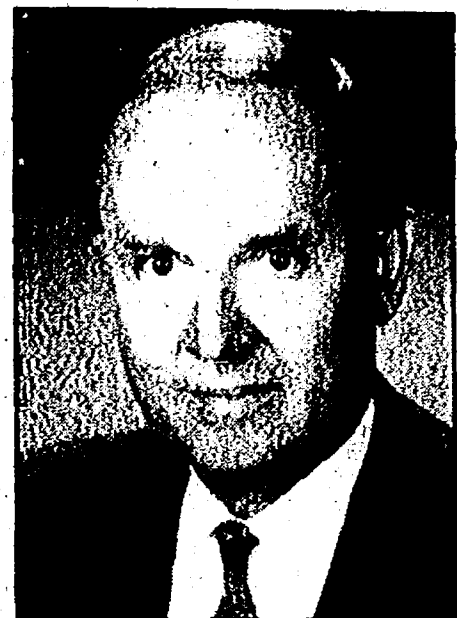

Hoben, who is retiring July 1, has been superintendent of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools since 1971.

"I deem it quite an honor," said the Plymouth Township resident of the honorary degree. "I'm very appreciative of their efforts."

Starting as a teacher, Hoben moved on to become a counselor, guidance director, principal, coordinator of Plymouth Community Schools Secondary Education and assistant superintendent for instruction before getting his current job.

Hoben has also served as president of the Plymouth Rotary Club, Plymouth Building Authority, Network of Outcome Based Schools, director of the Michigan Association of School Administrators and a board member of the United Fund and YMCA.

## Schools may borrow to buy computers under bill

School districts may borrow — going outside their operating budgets — for computer equipment as well as buildings, under a controversial state Senate bill.

"Telecommunications and technology-related services" are included in the list of things for which a school district may issue bonds. The bill amends a law passed last December allowing schools to sell bonds to renovate portions of buildings, libraries, athletic fields and other physical facilities.

Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, won approval of an amendment saying that computer services must be treated as an operating expense. Bouchard's amendment also limits the length of time for repayment to the life of the equipment.

Another amendment removed computer software from the bond-

ing list.

The Senate last week passed the bill 31-2 over the long, loud protests of conservative Republicans Doug Carl of Utica and Jack Welborn of Kalamazoo.

All area senators voted yes except William Faust, D-Westland, and David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, who were absent.

"What heretofore were called operating expenses, and subject to operating millage, we are now going to say can be covered by debt millage," Carl said. "School districts can do an end run (around tax limitations)," he said.

"This is outrageous. Bond salesmen out there will make lots of money urging districts to borrow, borrow, borrow," he said.

Carl said voters approved Proposal A March 15 believing that school operating taxes would be held to 6 mills on homes and farms and 24 mills on business

property and second homes — rates he called "sacrosanct." Permitting school districts to pay for computers outside their operating budgets would "circumvent the intent of the people."

"We are again flaunting the taxpayers by passing this type of legislation right after Proposal A," agreed Welborn.

He said it was all right to pay for wires and outlets for computers through a bond issue when a building is constructed or renovated. "It seems to me they (schools) ought to have enough money to operate efficiently and purchase those (computers) out of operating funds without having to bond," he said.

"We should allow a school district the option of putting a new roof on or to remodel a classroom without doing the entire school, but I think you are going too far with this proposal that allows

them to go in and bond for computers and technical programs.

"That should be an operational cost, not a cost put into bonds, spread into the future so future generations pay for it, rather than it being pay-as-you-go," Welborn said.

The brief battle exposed a long-term tendency in school budgeting: using the operating budget to pay salaries and requesting special millages or bond issues to pay for renovations, repairs and improvements of physical plant.

Proponents said technology is increasingly necessary and too expensive to be covered out of operating budgets. They argued that business borrows to buy machinery and amortizes it over a period of years through depreciation accounts.

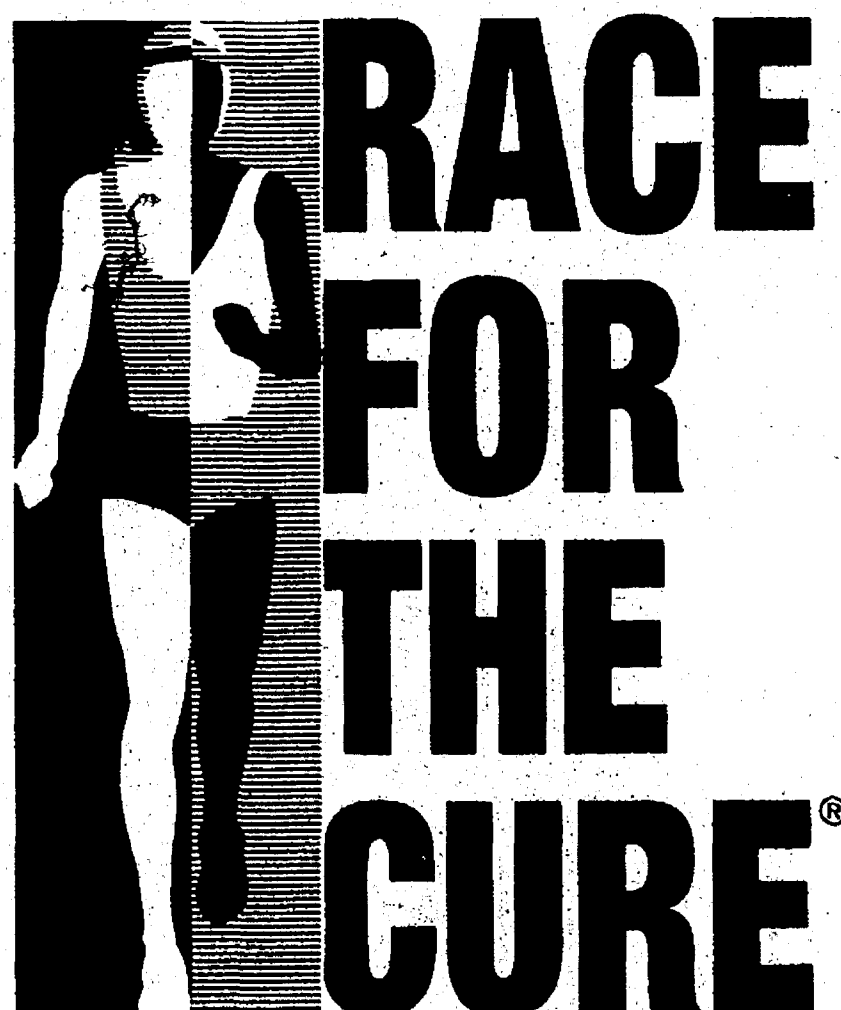

## Pearl Jam scores a KO with its fans

Pearl Jam drummer Dave Abbruzzese said in a 1992 interview that playing live shows with his band is like fighting Mike Tyson. If that's the case, Pearl Jam knocked out Detroit area audiences in the first round.

Performing two sold-out shows last weekend — March 19 at Detroit's Masonic Temple and March 20 at Ann Arbor's Crisler Arena — Pearl Jam reinforced their status as one of the top-selling acts in rock. Stripped-down stages adorned with only a few toys and burning candles didn't hinder the show a bit.

Tormented reluctant superstar/lead singer Eddie Vedder growled through 2½ hours of hits — and a cover of Neil Young's "Keep on Rockin' in the Free World" — in near perfection. (Like the 1992 Lollapalooza Festival, "Jeremy" was left off the set list.)

Bassist Jeff Ament, with a baby doll strapped to his back, jumped like a kangaroo around the stage as guitarist Stone Gossard kept his cool, bobbing his head in his trademark goose-like style. Mike McCready staked his claim on the left side of the stage, wailing away on his guitar.

Unlike the Crisler Arena show, Vedder strapped on a guitar for most of Pearl Jam's Masonic set, complementing guitarists Gossard and McCready. In Ann Arbor and Detroit, bassist Ament traded his bass for a slim stand-up model during "Glorified G" and "Daughter" off their latest self-titled album.

Shortly after taking the Masonic Temple stage, Vedder mumbled what so far has to be the understatement of the year: "We're going to be here for awhile. We're going to play some songs. No big deal."

Proving that bands and audiences feed off each other's energy, the Masonic Temple crowd stayed primarily subdued due to a subtle request by Vedder and the abundance of security and police officers. The singer, unkemptly dressed in a dark T-shirt and jeans, stomped in small circles. He released some energy during "Leash," walking along the edges of boxes lining the stage, and swinging back and forth over the audience from rope ladders hanging from the lights.

At the end of the show, Vedder downplayed his role as teen idol, tossing cigarettes into the audience. Toasting the crowd, he advised them to enjoy their youth, let the past be the past, and look forward to the future.

Energy was no problem at the Crisler Arena show. Sweaty fans crammed up against the stage barricade and began body surfing long before Vedder slowly approached the front of the stage, head down, smearing black cream around his eyes. Once he was finished he led the band into a rendition of "Jeremy." The stage looked like an elevated slam pit with Vedder, leading the group, thrashing around the stage and dragging his microphone stand along with him.

Even Vedder seemed somewhat surprised by the energy of the Crisler Arena crowd. He offered an explanation: "The other night we had a bomb scare. Last night some crazy people snuck backstage. Then tonight I heard a few people escaped from (a mental institution), and you can tell who they are by their yellow bracelets."

The main floor crowd, given yellow bracelets to wear, wasn't insulted the least bit.

Although the Ann Arbor show was plagued by unsecure parking and overwhelmed, poorly marked ushers, most fans weren't fazed. As the band tore through "Why Go Home" from their debut album "Ten," fans seemed to take the chorus to heart. Leaving early wasn't on their mind.

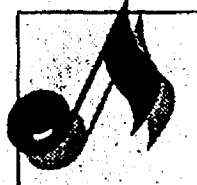

## Us3: Hip-hop and all that jazz

■ If you listen closely, you'll again hear the jazz musings of Reuben Wilson, Big John Patton and Art Blakey on "Hand on the Torch." Such samples are turning up in Us3's new release.

While Us3 producers Geoff Wilkinson and Mel Simpson were recording their debut "Hand on the Torch," they never thought about bringing their blend of jazz and hip-hop to the stage. But when their first live show turned into a near riot, they thought well, maybe there was a demand for it. "It was like one of the Beatles' gigs in the '60s," said Wilkinson via telephone from England about his mid-1993 show in Japan. "They actually pulled the (original) trumpet player (Gerard Presencer) off the stage. He was used to playing jazz in England, and he goes all the way to Japan and got pulled off the stage by screaming Japanese women."

"We started thinking that there could actually be a demand to do it live."

For that show, the band took six musicians with them. Since then the revolving band, which stopped at Detroit's Fox Theatre on Saturday, March 12, with UB40, has expanded to nine pieces. (Wilkinson and Simpson are the only two permanent members.) The musical force, which averages age 24, uses a few recordings (samples) at live shows, but mainly the work of saxophonists Tony Coles and Ed Jones, trumpeter Dominick Glover, bassist Geoffrey Gascoyne, drummer Cheryl Alleyne, keyboardist Timothy Vine, and rappers Rahsaan Kelly, Kobie Powell and Tukka Yoot. Although their stripped-down show in Japan was successful, Wilkinson and Simpson decided they owed it to the audience to play most of the pieces live.

"We thought the audience deserved it, really. Jazz is a music that has to be experienced live, I think. We wanted to make it completely live in order to do justice to the music and not cheat people," Wilkinson said.

While researching what other jazz/hip-hop bands were doing, they discovered that the shows lacked improvisation, which links the two music genres. Using samples was stale, Wilkinson said. Improvisation is what stirs up excitement.



"Would an audience rather see the two guys that produced the album on stage, or would they rather see really hot soloists? I know which one I'd choose," he said.

### Education is key

When the Wilkinson and Simpson created Us3, their original intent was to educate the public on the merits of jazz. As its tool, the band uses samples from the Blue Note Records' archives whose rights

were awarded to them after they sampled pieces without permission. The duo's first student was the Jamaican-born rapper Tukka Yoot, a current member of the lineup who they discovered in a studio.

"Tukka is kind of a great example of how I think we've got people into jazz, really. I've seen him buying John Coltrane CDs. I know he wouldn't have done that before. He would have bought his reggae records. We've managed to open his ears to jazz," Wilkinson said.

After his show at the Fox Theatre, Yoot said his discovery of jazz has brought his career full circle.

"I felt when I heard it that I had been missing something," Yoot said patting his face with a towel. "Now I listen to it all the time when I'm home. Educate is what the Us3 project set out to do. It worked. It rebounded onto me. I'm sure if I was

convinced, we could convince others."

Us3, whose lyrics are written by Yoot and fellow rappers Rahsaan Kelly and Kobie Powell, educates subtly. There is no preaching.

"Educate" is a horrible word when you involve it with music. We just kind of wanted to open the door and if people wanted to come through that door, it was there for them. I believe that young people have a real problem having access to jazz," Wilkinson said.

Radio and record company marketing specialists gear jazz toward an older audience, which alienates younger people, he said. Apparently, young people are paying attention to Us3. The video for the first single "Cantaloup (Flip Fantasia)" — sometimes affectionately known as the "bitty bitty bop" song — was included in MTV's trendy "Buzz Bin." Aside from that it has become a dance club hit. Many Us3 fans are unaware that they're learning something by Herbie Hancock other than "Rockit." The track uses excerpts from the musician's song "Cantaloupe Island."

"They don't know they're actually dancing to Herbie Hancock. We get sort of a perverse delight out of that as well. It's a bit subversive," he said with a laugh.

### A fine sample

"Hand on the Torch," which refers to the passing on of the jazz tradition, surprisingly is the only Blue Note album that has sold more

than 500,000 copies. The legendary blues label's archives has included works by Reuben Wilson, Lou Donaldson, Big John Patton, Art Blakey & the Jazz Messengers, Thelonious Monk, Grant Green, Bobby Hutcherson, Horace Silver and Donald Byrd, all of whom are sampled on the record.

"At first I thought that was amazing, but then I thought 'It's a real shame,'" said Jones, who met Wilkinson at a "Jazz Rap Weekend" in England. "It's a real tragedy" that legendary artists haven't achieved that status, he added.

For rapper Yoot, it was a "dream come true." He sees it as repaying his idols for influencing him. In return, jazz purists have lauded the group's effort.

"We anticipated probably a lot more criticism from the jazz purists. In Japan the jazz purists seem to accept it straight away. Like in Japan, they think really seriously about jazz and they really took us to heart, which was phenomenal. I think even the purists that might not like what we're doing accept it. One of the things were trying to do is get younger people into jazz. Everyone understands that and accepts that."

Some have vehemently opposed what the duo is doing, however.

"The one thing that we have been accused of is tearing pages out of the (jazz) Bible. But our 'stock in trade' answer to that is if we're tearing pages out of the Bible, then we're sanctioned by God."

## Spontaneity counts for Howling Diablos

The Howling Diablos may not be who you think they are. In fact, they're hoping not. The element of surprise is one of the big components of their enormous local popularity.

Depending on what night of the week you see them, the time of night you walk in, where it's at and who's sitting in with the core group that night, you're as likely to see one of the most amazing blues bands in town as you are a screaming rock'n'roll or envelope-pushing free jazz band. Although they may begin the night with a straight-ahead Detroit blues groove, they'll just as likely end with the Johnny Evans affectionately calls a "nut out."

"Our shows are always real spontaneous," said founder and saxophonist Evans, "to the point where we'll play tunes and the band doesn't even know them. If you create that kind of space where magic and cool stuff can happen, a lot of time it will."

Evans and co-founder Martin Gross, both longtime local music veterans, have been working together for more than a decade, and the chemistry is almost tangible. Singer/songwriter/guitarist Gross is a veteran of the Progressive Blues Band, the Bop Cats, the Urbanations and Little Tino and the Hawaiians, who had the hottest single in Detroit in 1984 with "Crazy Bout Those Tigers."

# Capra meets the Coens in Proxy'

It's New Year's Eve. Snow drifts by a troubled man perched atop a skyscraper ledge 44 floors high — not counting the mezzanine. How he got there and whether or not he'll jump was a familiar springboard for old Frank Capra movies like "Meet John Doe" or the ubiquitous "It's a Wonderful Life."

Mr. Capra, meet the Coens. Brothers Joel and Ethan, the writer/director team of "Barton Fink" and "Raising Arizona," have breathed new life into the shop-worn premise of "The Hudsucker Proxy," a fictionalized account of the inventor of the Hula Hoop and a visually dazzling tribute to fast-paced comedies of the 1930s.

Tim Robbins plays Norville Barnes, a recent graduate of the Muncie Business School, who lands a job in the mail room of Hudsucker Industries circa 1958. With the death of the company president and controlling interest up for public sale, Hud honchos want a new leader who can bring stock down, so it can be purchased for pennies.

In short, they want an imbecile, and they think they've found one

in Barnes. After all, the earnest Midwesterner walks around with sketches of his new product idea, basically a circle drawn in the middle of a sheet of paper. "You know," he says, shocked that no one else recognizes its brilliance, "for kids."

You know the rest of the story. That invention, the Hula Hoop, becomes a Baby Boomer phenomenon, catapults Barnes and Hudsucker to the top, and leaves Board Chairman Sidney J. Mussberger (Paul Newman) fuming, intent on breaking the young prodigy he personally advanced.

Enter Amy Archer (Jennifer Jason Leigh), a Pulitzer Prize-winning newspaper gal who becomes Barnes' secretary to get the inside scoop.

The Coens, along with "Evil Dead" director and former Detroit Sam Raimi, have scripted a clever little piece of nostalgia, full of wisecracks and overlapping dialogue. And while the emotion of the story gets overpowered by set design and crazy camera angles, it easily ranks as the year's niftiest picture.

In one of the movie's several well-edited sequences, a lone Hula Hoop rolls from an alley down the street and into the path

of a little boy. Viewed from above, the shot recalls the apes eyeing that mystical monolith at the opening of "2001: A Space Odyssey."

At this exact moment, an elementary school has let out for the afternoon. As the boy picks the toy up and starts to swivel and shake, a pack of screaming school kids round the street corner and stare in amazement at what they see. The Hula Hoop, formerly a bust, officially becomes a craze.

For his part, Robbins plays the role with congeniality and "gee whiz" American enthusiasm. It's a pleasure to see him doing slapstick with Paul Newman, who too rarely gets a chance to let his silver hair down.

Blink and you'll miss cameos by character actors Peter Gallagher (as a slick Italian crooner) and Steve Buscemi (as a beatnik coffeehouse server). We could stand to see more of them, along with Bruce Campbell, another former Detroit and star of TV's "Brisco County," as Smitty, the newspaperman.

As gum-snapping newswoman Archer, Jason Leigh does a dead-

on impersonation of Jean Arthur and Rosalind Russell. She's about 20 years out of time, but it hardly matters to the Coen brothers, whose movies read like pages of a 20th century history book, thrown up in the air and then hastily reassembled.

Dennis Gassner's set design is a knockout, especially the Decora skyscraper that houses Hudsucker. The mail room, inspired no doubt by "Metropolis" and "Brazil," is a nightmare of cables, tubes and feverishly working drones. The top-floor board room, meanwhile, is an exercise in monumental sparseness — only the heavy-lacquered board table and a ticker tape machine backed by the city in silhouette.

Some may see "The Hudsucker Proxy" as a one-joke movie, and indeed it does lose momentum after a while. It's the invention that the Coens bring to virtually every shot that keeps you twisting to this engagingly oddball comedy.

# 'Kalifornia:' A close call with crime

When faced with true, soulless evil, how would your average bleeding-heart intellectual respond? Would a close encounter with an utterly remorseless killer cause a change in the attitude that criminals need treatment, not incarceration and punishment?

On some levels that's the question posed by the 1993 film "Kalifornia" in which a writer and his girlfriend take along a killer and his girlfriend on a cross country drive. The writer, having spent his advance, needs help with expenses as he and his girlfriend, a photographer, visit the scenes of murders committed by serial killers.

David Duchovny and Michelle Forbes play the trendy leather jacket-clad pair who maybe aren't

as sophisticated and worldly as they might like to think. Duchovny's character in particular is fascinated and attracted by the sordid and twisted tales of mass murderers.

"You can't let stereotypes get in the way," he says after meeting their new travel companions.

There is a jarring contrast with the other couple, played as white trash personified by Brad Pitt and Juliette Lewis in the most memorable performances in the film. Pitt's greasy-haired and unkempt Early Grayce murders without a minute of remorse then makes a gift of a dead girl's shoes to the rather dimwitted Adele.

Early and Adele live in a run-down trailer, certainly not a mobile home, in the middle of what appears to be a junkyard. Early, who is already on parole, can't

hold a job, telling his parole officer that they didn't treat him right.

Faced with jail, Early decides it's time for him to relocate with Adele. He tells Adele people think quicker in California because of the heat and by law each month's rent is free.

Duchovny's Brian is the smug sort who sees himself as superior to the harmless but primitive Early. In the end, the writer doesn't have a clue to who he is really dealing with in Early.

Forbes' photographer warms up to the hapless Adele and tries to help her. It's her suspicions of Early that spark the upclose violence that was surely inevitable anyway.

In one scene, the violent Early

perfectly mocks the writer's amateur psychologist questions about how he feels when assaulting someone. The two even do a little shooting together.

Lewis' Adele, barely surviving on her meager wits and self-delusions, is the truly tragic figure of the quartet.

One of the things you might question about "Kalifornia" is whether the writer learned anything from his brush with terror. By the end of the journey that's not totally clear.

Evans was on that Teenage Records 45, too, as well as putting in frontline time with the Urbanations, who were managed by former MC5 manager, politico and impresario John Sinclair. It was Sinclair who, inadvertently, was responsible for the formation of the Howling Diablos.

"The first gig the band ever played was at the Michigan Gallery," Gross remembered.

"The first gig was a Gary Grimshaw art opening," Evans interjected. "He and I used to do this thing with John Sinclair called the Blues Scholars. He played drums; I played saxophone, and Sinclair would read his poetry. We were supposed to do that at the Michigan Gallery, and Sinclair had gone off somewhere, and Gary called up and said 'Why don't you and Martin put a band together for the opening?'"

Gross is quick to pay allegiance to the local poetry scene, as well, calling Mick Vranich and Word-ban'd a particular favorite act.

"The band kinda grew out of more the poetry scene which, to me, is where the Howling thing came from, like Ginsberg's 'Howl,'" he said. "I never wanted it to sound like a rockabilly band or anything else. Some people do draw those conclusions."

Rockabilly they most decidedly are not. Muddy Waters and Archie Shepp influences abound, and there are hints of stylistic predecessors like the MC5 and the Contemporary Jazz Quintet

and peers like Was (Not Was), Fishbone and whatever else the band absorbs. Bassist Mike Hollis and drummer Vin Eg (whose other band Sponge was just signed by Sony) make up the core of the band. However, the surprises always lay in which of their turntable selection of guitarists is on a sessions — Michael King, Bobby East of Killing Floor, Tim Diaz of Red C, or Jeff Grand of the Butler Twins blues band.

"It's not the easiest way to go for making money in the music business," said Gross of the band's diversity.

"We've never tried to think of a hit, or thought of what we can do to be famous. It's always just being real truthful with this music and having faith in that. That's why we do it."

## Getting "pinned" is a fashion must

**H**istorically, rites of passage have been commemorated with an appropriate pin. If you stop to ponder the decorative pin, you'll recall that your dad received a pin upon retirement or for 25 years' service to his company. You may have gotten pinned by your college boyfriend, a prelude to an engagement ring. That cherished pin was his fraternity insignia and probably still sits in the bottom of the jewelry box.

Jewelry designer Leslie Ann Pilling owns Presence II, 29260 Franklin Road in Southfield. She reminded me of an even-loftier purpose given the pin. In the military, pins are used as symbols of rank and seniority. As campaign buttons they become political, used throughout history to reflect personal ideals and opinions.

Your mother may have positioned her fancy brooch just so on a suit lapel, or maybe she threw her cashmere sweater over her shoulder, securing it with a pearl sweater guard.

Those same bejeweled pins are back, but the styles and presentations have changed. The "guard" might be arranged asymmetrically on a blazer pocket or worn like an epaulet on the shoulder of a jean jacket (\$60). Today, pins are everywhere.

Pilling designs pin enhancers for pearls, hat pins to group on an oversized sweater, (\$40) and pins attached to long necklaces that drape across the body (\$198).

Many women collect scatter pins to cluster on a collar or coat, tiny hugs or frogs or butterflies. "Pins are even used as home accessories," says Pilling, pointing to a large gold mesh bow that forms a curtain tie-back.

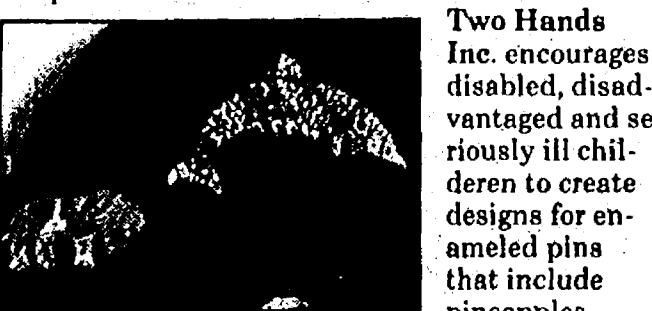
### Pin point plans

"Pins are a focal point. A woman takes the time to select them and put them on as an essential design element." She suggests displaying a pin collection on a beautiful pillow in the bedroom.

The Alliance for Homeless and Disabled Artists employs homeless people to craft sparkling pins of recycled Mardi Gras gowns and costumes (\$18-\$38). Examples of these pins look terrific grouped on the brim of a baseball cap. They're available at select Hudson's stores.

More perfect pins include Tiffany's "Fire-works" burst with the radiant colors of pink rubellite, violet tanzanite and sparkling diamonds. This spectacular pin collection explodes in showers of cascading gemstones (\$18,000-\$35,000) at Tiffany & Co. in the Somerset Collection in Troy. The "Race For the Cure" pin by Carolee depicts the figure of a female runner with a pink-enameled ribbon accent (\$25). The pin is available exclusively at Neilman Marcus and proceeds benefit the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer research.

## Trish McAvoy cosmetics keep it simple

**T**rish McAvoy, 43, is in town this week launching her neutrals-only palette at Jacobson's — in the Laurel Park Place store in Livonia and the Briarwood store in Ann Arbor.

After more than 20 years as one of New York's top makeup artists, creating the faces that filled Vogue and Harper's Bazaar, McAvoy produced her own line of cosmetics in 1975.

Until last year, she sold the products only to clients who visited her Central Park studio. Last year, she

offered the line to Bendel's Department Stores, with an instant success she hopes to duplicate at select Jacobson's this year.

Radiating the warmth that is also the trademark look of her cosmetics, McAvoy said makeup should be applied in a "fun frame of mind."

"The women who come to the McAvoy counter are the 16-year-old dressed in combat boots and 53-year-old dressed in a Chanel outfit with combat boots," she said with a wide smile. "I would use words like 'natural,' 'classic,' 'simple,' to describe my makeup philosophy."

McAvoy said she originally created the line for professional makeup artists and models. It differs from other cosmetics because the pigment is richer and there's a variety of yellow-based products, which McAvoy believes are more natural and attractive on most faces.

To illustrate her point, she wiped the green eyeshadow and orange lipstick off the face of good-humored Anita Durham of Farmington Hills. Within 10 minutes, Durham's repowdered and blended visage was the envy of onlookers.

"Gee," Durham said, seeming not to miss all the color. "This makeup feels so light and looks so natural."

"I just enhanced your own good looks," McAvoy reassured. "That's what it's all about."

A second feature of McAvoy's line

is the natural animal hair brushes, which are in demand by anyone who knows makeup application. The brushes are a one-time purchase guaranteed to last for years.

McAvoy's line is priced \$15-\$63. The shades are advertised as "trans-generational and trans-racial."

When a customer leaves a McAvoy counter, it is only after she has repeated on one side of her face, what the professionals have showed them on the other side. Customers also take home a personalized, shaded face chart to use as a guide for applying McAvoy's products themselves.

# Parents need to be kept informed of child's performance

**QUESTION:** Overall our school district and its programs are excellent. But I have a complaint. Why is it some teachers don't inform parents early in the school year when their child isn't doing what he is supposed to be doing? Our 10th grade son failed a class the first marking period of the school year and we didn't find out until we received his report card. We called the school but the teacher didn't return the call. We are not blaming the school for his lack of effort. But aren't there any phones in the school? This is not right!

**ANSWER:** I agree! Parents have a legitimate right to be kept informed and notified immediately if there is any sudden or unusual change in school performance or behavior by their child.

As a first-year teacher of science and math in the Grosse Ile School District, a community with many professional people, I learned that lesson fast. I was having the typical first-year teacher problems; that is, kids working on your head to see if you are for real. And, as a result, some students were not performing as well as their potential and

past performance would indicate. It was my fault as much as their fault.

Nevertheless, my first six-week report cards went home with some solid B students getting C(s), some "A" students getting B(s), C students getting D(s) and a few students failed for lack of effort and for disrupting the class.

I was blown away at my first parent-teacher conference trying to justify how I could lower a student grade because of poor classroom behavior. Parents, rightly so, pointed out that the class performance and behavior were separate issues.

Most of these parents were kind and reasonable; a few saw an opportunity to create a scapegoat for their own lack of control over their child. But all clearly indicated to me they wanted to be informed in a timely fashion . . . not after the fact. These parents were right. I was dead wrong. And devastated! But not stupid.

The solution that came to me was so simple. A written progress report; not used much back in the late 60s. A report that would go out after the first three weeks of the school year or anytime a parent needed to be notified of a child's performance.

The standard form I developed was

very simple, very objective, saying:

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Jones:

You should be aware that your son John:

- (1) Has not been turning in homework
- (2) Failed the last test (and other items).

One or both would be checked. The parent response was most positive.

But oh . . . those little devils. Some kids soon caught on and intercepted any letter to their parents in a school envelope to see if it was from Doyle. So, re-grouping, I sent the letter out in a plain envelope. But they recognized my handwriting. So typing the name and address of the parents became a neces-

sity. But then they checked all letters with no return address . . . and some kids were "steaming" letters open. What creativity!

I got nicknames like the Mailman (and others that I won't mention). Being tenacious, letters were sent to the office where the father or mother worked, and then the victory was mine.

But something was lacking. My focus was totally on negative aspects. So I decided to "accentuate the positive."

Another form letter was developed as a follow-up. This form letter said something like: "I would like to take this opportunity to tell you how much your daughter has improved in my class. Her homework, attention to task, test scores, behavior, attitude (whatever) has greatly improved and it is a pleasure to have her in my class."

The feedback from parents was amazing. People want teachers and building administrators to be open and caring; caring about their child.

And the teacher not returning a phone call is inexcusable. If teacher contracts in Michigan weren't so powerful, that teacher should be suspended without pay for a reasonable amount of time. But please, first call

back and check to see if a student aide took the message and dropped the ball. Principals and building secretaries I know simply do not let this happen.

One of the worst scenarios I ever experienced was as the new assistant superintendent in a quality Michigan school district. It was an October parent-teacher conference in the high school gymnasium. I shook the hand of a supportive parent. He and his wife sat down in front of the teacher. The parent asked, "How is my kid doing?" The teacher said, "He failed this first marking period. You will be getting the report card tomorrow."

Totally insane! Parents have a right to know and a progress report should be standard operating procedure. Hey, even my gas station tells me when I'm low on oil . . . before the engine is blown away.

Most would also learn that abstinence and moderation are conducive to a more happy, successful and enduring lifestyle. The alcohol-free nightclub is a laudable approach for improving the educational process. It will eliminate many traumatic head and heart aches of future generations.

## Local commissioners want officials' names off signs

Wayne County Commissioner Michelle Plawecki objects to signs throughout the county announcing "A better road is on the way" because county Executive Edward McNamara's name is on each sign.

"I've had people calling me up asking why his name is on those signs," said Plawecki, D-Dearborn Heights, whose district includes most of Redford Township.

It bugs Plawecki that signs at county maintenance yards have McNamara's name on them, but not the name of the local commissioner.

The commissioner's name should be on the sign, she said, because people need to know who

to complain to.

"Ed McNamara is not the one who takes constituent complaints," she said.

As a result of Plawecki's protest, a proposed ordinance has emerged from the commission's committee on roads, airports and public services.

Sponsored by commissioners Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, Bryan Amann, D-Wayne, and Ricardo Solomon, D-Detroit, the ordinance would prohibit "the erection of signs which bear the names of elected officials," calling that practice "tantamount to the expenditure of public funds for the purpose of political campaigning."

The commission is expected to discuss the proposed ordinance

Tuesday, March 29, and vote on it as early as Thursday, April 7.

Plawecki is unhappy with the ordinance as currently written. She wants it to say that, if the county executive's name is on a sign, then the relevant county commissioner's name has to be on the sign, too.

Amann, who also represents Canton Township, said Friday he believes Plawecki doesn't have enough support for that.

"As far as I'm concerned, I don't want to see any of our names on signs," Amann said.

McCotter, who also represents Plymouth and Plymouth Township, has said he doesn't want his name on county signs.

McNamara did not return the Observer's phone calls by press time.

## Draft says 'any person' can paint

Although it likely will be altered if it becomes law, the initial draft of the Wayne County Commission's proposed sign ordinance permits "any person" to cover McNamara's name with spray paint on any sign in the county.

Section III of the ordinance, in part, reads, "Any person shall, however, have the right to enter upon county property or right-of-way at any reasonable time for the limited purpose of removing, erasing, or painting over the name of any elected officer which may appear upon a sign, vehicle, or equipment, provided that this work is done in a safe, neat and unobtrusive manner without defacing the remainder of the sign, equipment or vehicle."

When that portion of the proposed ordinance was read to Amann, he said, "That's crazy. Someone doesn't know what they're doing."

Amann predicted an early demise for that sentence.

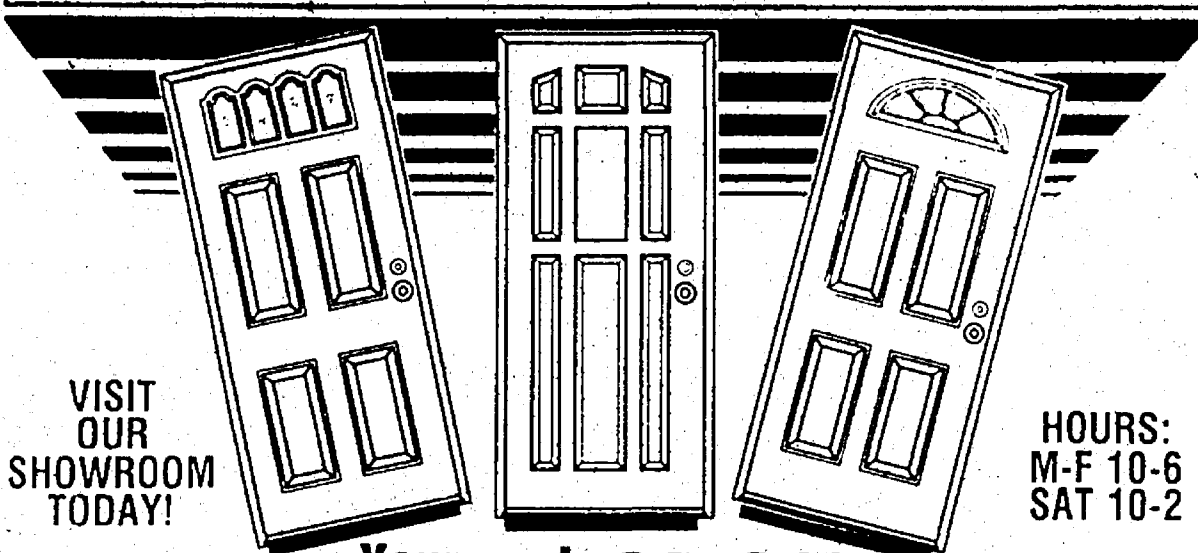

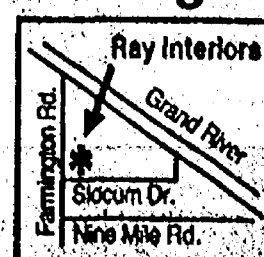

## Master the technique of eating artichokes

I think it was Julia Child who said - "The artichoke is the only vegetable that, when you finish eating it, you have more on your plate than when you started." We never ate anything as elusive as an artichoke in Wyandotte not because it wasn't available, but because the only vegetable we ate was corn.

I can to this day, recall the first time I ever encountered an artichoke. I was just a lad fresh out of high school, and was interviewing for a cook's job at the Top of the Flame, at that time a gourmet eatery on the top floor of what used to be the Michcon Gas building at the foot of Woodward downtown. Fortunately, I was accompanied by my neighbor's mother who was one of those gracious elevator operators that have gone the way of 10 cent ice cream cones.

Twila was her name and fine dining was her game. She acquainted the taste buds of this little ole boy from Downriver to the taste of life in the big city. I don't think I liked the taste of my first artichoke, especially when I found myself putting more effort into eating it than anything else. It was but a week later that I discovered the tasty thistle steamed and marinated at a little cozy bistro dubbed the Kickapoo on Grosse Isle. I have been a faithful admirer ever since.

Amongst it's other devotees, the artichoke is regarded as a thing of epicurean elegance and delight. It first came into prominence as a food-stuff in 16th century Italy. It has gone on to win acceptance as a delicacy by many of the cognoscenti of the Western world, but is curiously left unknown or disdained among people's everywhere. My guess is that in addition to its velvety and buttery taste, it is indeed just a plain edible thistle with thorns.

### Eating tips

An artichoke is by far the only vegetable I can recall that is so demanding to eat. There are three phases to enjoying an artichoke. The first is the most fun and requires the fingers. This stage consists of dismantling, one by one, the artichoke's outer layer of petals also known as bracts and dipping their fleshy lower tips into melted butter or a sauce. The petals are placed between the teeth and then gently pulled, extracting fleshy tidbits from their flowery base. There are some 40 odd petals so pluck, dip and nibble from a basic artichoke.

Phase two is the most exacting and requires the dexterity of a surgeon. Once the petals are enjoyed, the diner must coordinate the fingers and a knife in unison to extract and dispose of the inedible center, usually referred to as the choke. Unskilled laborers will leave fragments of the choke and yes, to consume the choke will, for a lack of better terms, "choke" you.

This done, phase three simply requires the diner to cut the remaining artichoke heart into bite-sized morsels, again to be enjoyed with a sauce or butter.

An ungarnished artichoke is one of the least fattening foods on earth, averaging a mere 25 calories. This virtue, however, diminishes when the vegetable is accompanied by artery clogging butter, mayonnaise and hollandaise sauce.

### Cooking methods

One of the best ways to enjoy an artichoke is to steam it. Ah, but that technique too deserves some special remarks. To first prepare an artichoke, the cook, to avoid any possible injury of the diner, should snip off the thorny tips of the artichoke petals. Best done with kitchen scissors, the artichoke will then have to be placed in an acidulated bath to keep from turning brown - (an acidulated bath is 1 quart of water mixed with 1/4 cup lemon juice).

Next, the long rubbery stem must be chopped off as close to the base as possible to facilitate standing. Yours truly prefers to remove about a dozen or so of the petals surrounding the base as these are usually tough and chewy, even after steaming.

Next, "X" marks the base with a sharp paring knife, about 1/4 inch deep to facilitate cooking and ensure a tender heart. At this point the artichoke can be steamed, covered for upwards of 30 minutes or boiled for about the same time. You can discern the doneness when a sharp paring knife is inserted into the base and easily pulls out.

Serve the artichoke immediately at this point, you can stuff the artichoke with a mixture of bread stuffing, eggs and/or meat.

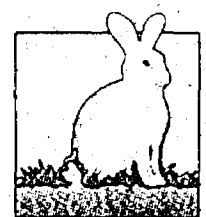

# Easter Bread

KEEPS THE HOME FIRES BURNING



Bread is the staff of life. For Dr. Robert Majewski, baking the Easter bread he made as a child, is a way of sharing his Polish American heritage with his family, and staying in touch with family in other states.

"Having the same bread my family is having on Easter perpetuates the tradition," said Dr. Robert Majewski who grew up in Massachusetts. "We can't always be together, but can share the same bread."

Majewski, has lived in Livonia with his wife Judy and

their sons, Mark, 11 and Matthew, 4 for the past four years. He learned how to bake the sweet citrus flavored raisin bread called babka from his mother when he was 10, and is passing the tradition on to his sons.

In addition to baking bread for family and friends, Majewski sends a loaf to his

former instructor Dr. Chet Glomski in Buffalo, New York.

"When I was in dental school a friend of mine and I decided to bake Easter bread. We gave the extra loaf to Dr. Glomski. The first year I graduated from dental school I sent him one as a lark on Palm Sunday. He sent me a very nice thank you. I've sent him one every year. This is the 23rd year in a row," said Majewski a dentist at Mott Children's Health Center in Flint.

Since graduating from dental school, Majewski has fine-

tuned his bread baking skills. His sons enjoy helping him.

On this particular day, Matthew is standing at the counter grating lemon peel, while his brother helps braid dough. Judy stands back watching. Baking bread is a father and son project.

Because of health concerns, Majewski reduced the amount of eggs in his mother's recipe, substituting two eggs, plus four egg whites for four whole eggs. The only noticeable difference is a lighter colored batter.

## Southern cook cuts fat in 'down home' recipes

Beth Mele of Livonia has a great recipe for those of you looking for an easy way to fill a lot of tummies. Mele moved to Livonia two years ago from Baton Rouge, La. As a clinical physicist at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, she is responsible for assisting physicians in administering radioactive implant therapy. Because her schedule sometimes keeps her at the hospital at all different hours, she likes to prepare recipes that are easy and provide leftovers for lunches and late dinners.

She is a wonderful cook but does not like to use all the fat most of the "down home" recipes require. Many Southern recipes call for a "roux." This is a flour and oil mixture that is used to thicken a stew or make gravy. Mele says it takes practice and patience to make a proper roux.

Start by melting the butter or oil in a pan. Add equal parts of flour, stirring continuously. The flour and oil will make a paste. As the paste cooks, it turns a rich brown color. If not watched carefully at this point, it will quickly burn, and then you have to start over.

Although it does thicken the recipe nicely, it will add a large amount of unnecessary fat to the recipe. Fortunately, Mele believes it is not necessary in most recipes.

In her makeover recipe, I eliminated the thigh meat because of its high fat content. By using only boneless, skinless chicken breasts, I reduced the total fat from the chicken from 115.6 grams of fat to 30 grams.

### Louisiana Chicken Stew Original Recipe

1/4 cup vegetable oil  
2 large whole chicken breasts (about 3 pounds) skin on, cut into 8 pieces  
12 chicken thighs (about 4 pounds)  
1/4 cup flour

2 cups coarsely chopped celery  
2 medium green bell peppers, coarsely chopped

2 medium green bell peppers, coarsely chopped  
1 can (32 ounces) "no salt added" tomatoes, chopped, with juice  
4 tablespoons "no salt added" tomato paste  
1 teaspoon hot pepper sauce  
3 cans (10.5 ounces each) Campbell's low sodium chicken broth  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
2 large bay leaves  
2 large garlic cloves, minced  
1/2 teaspoon black pepper  
1/4 pound precooked Louis Rich brand Polish turkey sausage  
Brown all chicken in large non-stick Dutch oven or stew pot. Remove chicken to a platter. Place onion, celery, green peppers and 1/4 cup water in pot and cook for 5 minutes. By eliminating the oil for the roux, 66 grams of fat was omitted. Substituting turkey sausage for andouille sausage saved 22 grams of fat. Andouille sausage is a spicy hot sausage that has a strong garlic flavor. Many southern cooks use it, especially in Cajun recipes.

After visiting New Orleans in October, I became addicted to Cajun food. There is nothing else like it. And, from what I am told, New Orleans has some of the best restaurants in the United States.

The only restaurant I really wanted to eat at was K. Paul's. It is owned by chef Paul Prudhomme. There is no way to describe how wonderful his food is. But it is very high in fat. Fortunately for all us Cajun lovers, he has published a new book called "Fork in The Road," (Morrow, New York 1993). These are favorite Cajun recipes with the fat reduced. If you do check out this book, I highly recommend trying two recipes — New Shrimp Remoulade and Shrimp Bascom. Both are absolutely incredible and fun to

make.

To enhance the citrus flavor of the bread, Majewski uses pure orange oil. He uses golden raisins, because he prefers the flavor.

Like their father, Matthew and Mark are drawn to the physical part of making bread — cracking eggs, grating lemon and orange peel, and kneading the dough. "My participation is eating," said Judy.

"I like the kneading, the smells. It still amazes me everytime I watch the yeast grow," said Majewski, his sons nodding in agreement.

Majewski, like many other Polish Americans, still colors his Easter eggs in a natural dye made from yellow or red onion skins, or beet peelings.

One of his favorite childhood memories is an Easter game that involved tapping Easter eggs with

his brothers and sisters. You and another person tap eggs, if your egg doesn't crack you're the winner. "The eggs dyed in onion skins were the strongest," he said.

Another Polish tradition is for the oldest person in the house to greet each guest with a wedge of blessed hard-cooked egg and wish him or her good health and happiness.

Wedges of hard boiled eggs are often eaten with a little bit of horseradish as a reminder of the bitter suffering of Jesus Christ.

On Saturday, Majewski and his family will pack bread and other Easter food into a basket to take to their church, St. Edith's in Livonia, to be blessed. Many suburban churches offer this service. Italian Americans also take Easter foods to church to be blessed.

To learn more about Polish Easter traditions attend the Swie-

conka Easter Luncheon Sunday, April 10 at the American Polish Cultural Center, 2975 E. Maple Road (15 Mile Road at Dequindre in Troy). ## Sweet bread perfect for breakfast

### POLISH BABKA BREAD

½ cup sugar  
½ teaspoon salt  
½ cup butter or margarine  
1 cup milk, scalded  
¼ cup water  
2 packages yeast  
6 to 7 cups flour (may need a little more)  
4 eggs beaten (or use 2 eggs plus 4 egg whites)  
1 tablespoon orange rind, grated  
1 tablespoon lemon rind, grated  
1 cup raisins (golden raisins are best)  
1 tablespoon vanilla or amaretto

Dissolve 2 tablespoons sugar and yeast in the water, heated to 105 to 115 degrees F. Melt the butter and dissolve the remaining sugar in the scalded milk. Add one half of the flour to the milk, butter, sugar mixture and mix well.

Beat the eggs, adding the salt and vanilla.

Combine the milk and flour

mixture, the eggs and the yeast. Mix well, adding the raisins and the orange and lemon rinds. Add remaining flour.

Knead dough for 5 to 10 minutes, adding flour to keep it from getting sticky. Let rise, until doubled in bulk. Punch down the dough.

Form into loaves — traditional form is a braid; one tube or bundt pan works well also.

Place dough into well-greased pans. Let rise again, until doubled in bulk. Bake in 350 degree F. oven for 45 minutes. After 15 to 20 minutes, check loaves; if the tops are browning too quickly, cover with aluminum foil. Also, brushing the loaves with melted butter adds a nice glaze. Yield two loaves, or one large bundt pan size. Recipe easily doubled.

### POLISH EASTER BREAD

½ cup margarine or butter, softened  
½ cup sugar  
3 egg yolks  
1 package active dry yeast  
¼ cup warm water (105 to 115 degrees)

2 teaspoons grated orange peel  
1 teaspoon grated lemon peel  
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
½ teaspoon salt  
4 cups all-purpose flour  
1 cup lukewarm milk (scalded, then cooled)  
1 cup golden raisins

Beat margarine and sugar in large bowl until blended. Beat in egg yolks until well blended. Dissolve yeast in warm water. Stir yeast mixture, orange peel, lemon peel, cinnamon and salt into margarine mixture. Stir in flour alternately with the milk, beating well after each addition, until soft dough forms. Stir in raisins. Cover, let rise in warm place until double, about 1½ hours. Stir down dough; spoon into greased and floured tube pan 10 by 4 inches, or 12-cup bundt cake pan. Cover; let rise until double, about 1 hour.

Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Bake until bread is golden brown, 35 to 40 minutes. Cool 5 minutes. Remove from pan; cool completely. Sprinkle with powdered sugar if desired. Yield 1 loaf.

## Artichoke dip tasty, easy to prepare

### ARTICHOKES

4 artichokes  
1 lemon, halved  
1 tablespoon vegetable oil

Cut off and discard the stems of the artichokes with a stainless steel knife. Break off the tough outer leaves and cut off the top ¼ of the artichoke.

Snip off the thorny tips of the artichoke leaves with scissors and rub the edges with half the cut lemon. Arrange the artichokes in one layer in a large saucepan and add enough water to come halfway up the sides of the artichokes. Drizzle the artichokes with the

remaining lemon juice and the oil. Sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste. Bring the liquid to a boil, covered, then reduce the pan to a good simmer and simmer the artichokes for 25-45 minutes or until base is tender.

If you've been to a party in the area, you've probably enjoyed this artichoke dish without even knowing what you were eating. It's an old favorite that bears repeating. It's not only tasty, but also easy to prepare.

### HOT ARTICHOKE DIP

1 (15 ounce) can artichoke hearts, drained — (purchase artichoke hearts in water or brine, not pickled)

or marinated)  
1 cup real mayonnaise  
1 cup Parmesan cheese (preferably freshly grated)

Drain and rinse the artichoke hearts and chop fine. Place in a bowl with mayonnaise and Parmesan cheese. Mix well. Pour into a lightly greased baking dish and place under the broiler for 5-10 minutes or until golden brown.

Serve with crackers, party bread or breadsticks.

Chef's Secret: Try this recipe with some cooked, crisp, crumbled bacon or stir in a finely grated small onion. It can also be baked at 375 degrees for 30 to 45 minutes, uncovered, or until golden. Make this dip with real mayonnaise as salad dressing with separate while cooking.

## How to keep produce fresh

Here are some tips from the Michigan Department of Agriculture to keep in mind as you prepare fresh food for you or your family.

Many shoppers place fresh fruits and vegetables into plastic bags provided by grocery stores. These bags are a convenient way of protecting the produce while shopping or during the trip home. But fresh food should never be stored in closed, plastic bags because condensation that occurs may hasten ripening or cause the growth of mold.

Never place washed produce back into a bag that once held unwashed food; you don't want to contaminate clean food with micro-organisms.

Wash fruits and vegetables in cold water.

Some fruits and vegetables, like strawberries and mushrooms, have a high water content and should only be washed just prior to eating. Store these foods away from washed produce in the refrigerator.

- 1/2 cup frozen peas
- 1/4 cup chopped red sweet pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1/2 cup freshly shredded or grated Parmesan cheese (about 2 ounces)
- Ground black pepper

Cook linguine or spaghetti according to package directions.

Meanwhile, spray a medium saucepan with nonstick coating. Cook bacon in saucepan until crisp and light brown. Drain on paper towels. Wipe saucepan clean with a paper towel.

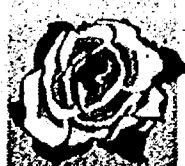

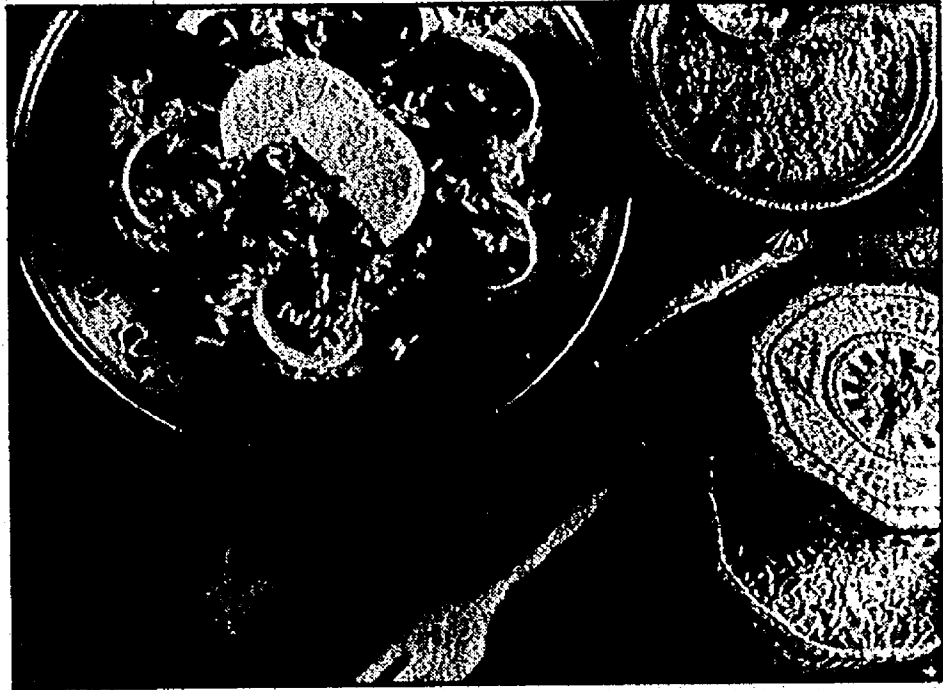
# Lentils and rice, one pot meal

Protein plays an essential role in maintaining health, but many health experts are calling into question the amount of protein Americans normally eat. Since our meals typically focus on meat, poultry, eggs, cheese and other protein-rich foods, we often consume as much as twice the amount of protein we need each day. According to the American Institute for Cancer Research, the recommended daily allowance of protein is 50 grams for women ages 25-50, and 63 grams for men.

Studies have shown that countries where people eat large amounts of animal protein have a higher incidence of heart disease, diabetes and colon or breast cancer. However, although high-protein foods such as meat and dairy products are often high in fat — which is known to increase cancer risk — not enough is known about protein itself to rule it out as a potential cancer risk factor.

Until further research is done on the health effects of protein, the American Institute for Cancer Research recommends choosing low-fat protein sources as part of a healthful diet. Eating skim and low-fat dairy products and extra-lean cuts of meat is a good start, particularly in modest portions (three or four ounces of meat per meal). It is easier to cut back by replacing some animal protein with extra plant protein from dried beans, potatoes, pasta, deer, or corn, and use just a little meat or cheese for flavor. Whole-grain cereals and breads are also good protein sources.

Look at protein as an important

part of your diet, but not the most important part. Most Americans can cut back on protein without jeopardizing their health. By shifting the focus of your meals to give equal attention to meats, fruits, vegetables and grains, you can provide better balance to your diet and help avoid health problems associated with an excess or deficiency of any important nutrients.

Lentil Rice Delight provides a meal in one pot, since the lentils and rice combined make a good low-fat protein source. The fat and calorie content is already fairly low for a whole meal; however, you can reduce it even more by substituting white wine, low-fat broth, or water for the oil.

## LENTIL RICE DELIGHT

- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 Tablespoon oil (or use 2 Tablespoons white wine, low-fat broth or water for less fat)

- ¾ cup brown rice, uncooked
- ½ teaspoon curry powder
- 2½ cups water
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup lentils, rinsed
- 1½ Tablespoons lemon juice
- 5 ounces, frozen spinach (or ½ pound fresh spinach, stems removed)

Saute the chopped onion and garlic in the oil (or white wine, broth or water). Add the rice and curry; saute 1 or 2 minutes more. Add the water, salt, lentils and lemon juice, and simmer 45 minutes, covered. Add the spinach and simmer a few more minutes until the spinach is tender.

If a spicier flavor is desired, add a dash of hot pepper sauce or chili powder before serving.

Each of the 2 servings (2 cups each) contains 9 grams of fat and 480 calories.

## VITAMIN E FOR MUSCLE SORENESS

Preliminary research seems to indicate that vitamin E supplementation may reduce the muscle damage that accompanies rigorous exercise routines. The evidence that led to this conclusion comes from a study of 21 normal young and older men who took part in an exercise program for 48 days. Half the men took 800 international units of vitamin E, while the other half took a placebo. Muscle damage in each man was assessed on the basis of biopsies from the younger men's leg muscles and the presence of by-products of fat oxidation in the urine of all the men. The results showed that the group taking vitamin E, an antioxidant, exhibited less exercise-induced muscle damage than the placebo group. Bearing this in mind, exercisers may want to take vitamin E to reduce muscle soreness and inflammation.

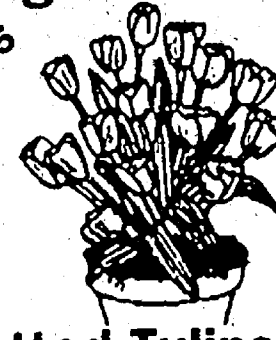

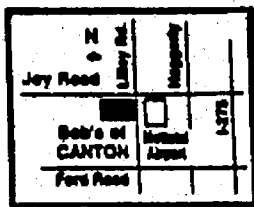

# Bake a batch of hot cross biscuits for Easter

Family fun at Easter time can include more than coloring eggs and hunting for chocolate bunnies. Baking together offers a double bonus: quality time with your children and delicious results the whole family will enjoy eating.

There's even a history lesson to be teamed when you select a traditional recipe with a contemporary twist. Hot cross buns, a not-too-sweet yeast roll flavored with currants and topped with icing in the shape of a cross, is an English bread that predates Christianity. These buns first were baked to honor the Goddess of Spring. Later, when the Christian faith came to England, bakers slashed a cross on the tops of the buns, and the buns became associated with Good Friday.

Because they rely on yeast to make them rise, traditional hot cross buns require both care and time. Hot Cross Biscuits, on the other hand, are much quicker and easier to make.

A biscuit at its most basic requires just five ingredients: flour, baking powder, salt, shortening or butter and milk. Because they use baking powder instead of yeast for leavening, biscuits are sometimes referred to as "quick breads."

Some biscuit recipes call for buttermilk and baking soda; others use grains such as oats in place of some of the flour. Many biscuit variations include additional ingredients such as dried or

fresh fruit, nuts, spices, even chocolate chips. And not all biscuits are sweet. Cheese, herbs, olives, shredded carrots, sun-dried tomatoes, diced ham, chilies and other savory ingredients are also found in biscuit recipes.

So how should a biscuit look and taste? According to Karen Doherty, a manager in the Quaker Kitchens, a perfect biscuit is light and tender with a golden brown crust and straight, even sides. When baking hot cross biscuits, or any other biscuit, Doherty has these tips.

■ Combine dry ingredients thoroughly to evenly distribute the baking powder.

■ When substituting oats for part of the flour, either quick or old fashioned oats can be used. Biscuits made with old fashioned oats will have a heartier texture and whole-grain flavor. Oats may be substituted for up to one-third of the flour in recipes for biscuits, muffins and other breads.

■ For the flakiest biscuits, use chilled butter, margarine or shortening and a pastry blender, two knives or your fingertips to combine the fat with the dry ingredients. The mixture should look like coarse crumbs.

■ Add milk all at once and stir just until the dry ingredients are moistened and the dough clumps together.

■ Knead dough quickly and gently 6 to 8 times on a lightly

floured surface just until no longer sticky. Too much flour and overkneading the dough will make biscuits tough.

■ Roll or pat dough to an even thickness, usually 1/4 inch.

■ Cut biscuits with a floured biscuit cutter and a straight downward motion.

■ Avoid twisting the biscuit cutter or biscuits may rise unevenly.

■ Brush tops of biscuits with milk, melted butter or margarine before baking for richer brown tops. If desired, sprinkle with additional oats.

■ Bake biscuits in a preheated hot (425-450° F.) oven until light golden brown, and serve hot.

## HOT CROSS BISCUITS

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup Quaker oats (quick or old fashioned, uncooked)
- 2 tablespoons firmly packed brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1/2 cup (5 tablespoons plus 1 teaspoon) margarine or butter, chilled
- 1/4 cup dried currants or raisins
- 1 teaspoon grated orange peel
- 3/4 cup buttermilk
- 1 tablespoon margarine or butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons Quaker oats

(quick or old fashioned, uncooked)

icing

1/2 cup powdered sugar

1 to 2 teaspoons buttermilk

Heat oven to 450 degrees F.

Lightly grease cookie sheet. In large bowl, combine first 7 ingredients; mix well. Cut in margarine with pastry blender or 2 knives until crumbly. Stir in currants and orange peel. Add buttermilk, mixing just until moistened. Turn out onto lightly floured surface; knead gently 6 to 8 times.

Roll or pat dough to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut with floured 2 1/2-inch biscuit cutter. Gather dough scraps together (do not knead); reroll and cut until all dough is used. Place on prepared cookie sheet. Brush tops with melted margarine and sprinkle with remaining oats. Bake 10 to 12 minutes or until light golden brown. Remove to wire rack; cool 3 minutes.

For icing, combine powdered sugar and buttermilk; mix well. Using a small spoon, drizzle icing on each biscuit in the shape of a cross.

## Pork association offers tips for storing ham

Here are some ham storage tips from the Michigan Pork Producers Association.

■ Place purchased ham in original wrapping in refrigerator 7 to 10 days. Slices should be used within 3 to 4 days.

■ Vacuum-packaged hams, unopened, will keep at least two weeks in the refrigerator.

■ Canned hams should be refrigerated until ready to use.

■ Leftover cooked ham should be tightly wrapped and refrigerated promptly after the meal and can be stored in the refrigerator for 4 to 5 days.

Freezing deteriorates ham quality. If you must freeze, wrap tightly and store in freezer up to two months.

Most area coaches would like to be in Paul Holmberg's shoes.

"We have an outstanding person back in just about every event," said the Livonia Stevenson girls track coach. "But we're looking for backups. We don't have that depth."

With 65 girls on the roster, Stevenson once again will be competitive in the Western Lakes Activities Association. (The Spartans open their dual meet season 3:30 p.m. Wednesday at home against city rival Franklin.)

Last year, the Spartans finished third in both the regionals and WLAA to Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton.

Holmberg lost distance standout A.J. Koritnik to graduation, along with Stacy Prais and Dina Belleperche.

Koritnik was tops in Observerland in the 3,200-meter run (11:21.4) and was ranked in the top 10 in the 1,600 (5:17.6). Belleperche was sixth in the discus (106 feet, 4 inches).

The leading returnee is first-team All-Area high jumper Colleen Lesondak, who cleared 5-6 as a sophomore. She is a regional champion.

Senior Cathy Bacile was a top 10 area performer in the long jump (16-3/4) and 200 dash (26.8).

Also back is senior Jill Eupizi, who clocked a 15.9 in the 100 hurdles, and senior Rachel Clark, second in the area in the discus (114-11) and eighth in the shot put (33-1/4).

Yet another standout is All-Area cross country performer Bridget MacKinnon, a senior who went 5:26.9 last season in the 1,600, and 11:31.1 in the 3,200. Sophomore Jeannette Stojcevski returns in the 300 hurdles (49.3).

Other Spartan returnees include juniors Nicole Lancot (hurdles/400), Kelly Prais (middle distance) and Kelly Levine (hurdles).

Sophomores Michelle Catenacci (400), Colleen Creehan (distance) and Lynn Knapp (distance) should also add depth, while seniors Laura Flanagan (shot put/discus) and Julie Cahill (distance) also figure prominently for Holmberg.

"We have fewer kids out than we've had in a long time," Holmberg said. "We have only 18 freshman."

A lot of area coaches, however, would trade shoes with the Stevenson coach.

Other Glenn notables include junior high jumper Elizabeth Swanguarian (4-10), senior Akua Saulsberry (sprints), senior Gretchen Schroeder (distance), senior Katie Niman (sprints), freshman Latoi Messner (sprints), senior Michelle Molitor

Livonia Clarenceville's Dick Davis prematurely announced his retirement from coaching.

"We do not have a team," he said. "We had only nine girls and eight boys sign up, but only eight showed up all together."

"We tried to get one going, but there was not enough participation. I'm planning to retire from teaching next year."

"Hopefully they will make an effort to bring it back."

# Madonna to host defending NAIA champ St. Francis

What a way to welcome the nation's No. 1-ranked baseball team in the NAIA: with all sorts of new additions.

That's exactly what Madonna University has planned for this week's invasion of the Saints from the College of St. Francis (Joliet, Ill.), winners of the NAIA World Series last season.

Madonna coach Mike George hopes the team's field, located at the former Livonia Bentley, will be upgraded with the addition of a scoreboard (donated by Pepsi

Cola) and a press box/refreshment stand.

And he hopes his team will be improved with the addition of a new coach — Greg Haeger, a Livonia native and Redford Catholic Central graduate.

Haeger will take over the duties as George's pitching coach. He has the proper credentials: Haeger played first base and pitched at the University of Michigan until 1990. He missed a great part of the '90 season after wrist surgery

that limited his at-bats.

The injury resulted in his switching from first base to the mound near the end of the season. He didn't get much time in pitching — Haeger estimated about eight innings in five appearances — but that June he was drafted by the Tigers as a pitcher.

He was part of the club's Class A Lakeland team that won the championship in '92, but the following off-season Haeger wrecked a knee that required reconstructive surgery. The club released him a year ago.

At Lakeland, Haeger said he

was "doing a lot of everything — spot starting, long relief, set-up, just about everything." His injury occurred during a pickup basketball game. "I was doing something I shouldn't have been doing," he said.

Haeger hopes to add only positives to Madonna's pitching, even with his late start. He was added to George's staff last week after his roommate, Sean Maloney, a former Madonna player, told George about his availability.

His 2½ years pitching in the minor leagues can only be a help to Madonna's staff. George had

been without an in-season pitching coach; Mark Falvo had worked with his staff during the pre-season, but Falvo also coaches Dearborn Divine Child's team and was unavailable during the season.

The Fighting Crusaders will need the help against St. Francis. Steve Ochman, a senior righthander who was 6-2 with a school-record 1.51 earned run average in '93, is the staff ace. Ochman is 0-1 thus far this season, but he's listed as one of the top four players in the NAIA.

Three hurlers have two wins apiece for the 9-9 Saints, none

with previous varsity experience as a starter: seniors Chad Capista and Chris Rentz, and Bill Jones, a junior.

St. Francis' hitting is paced by junior first baseman/outfielder Dave DeHaan, who is currently hitting .344 with two homers and 27 runs batted in. Junior shortstop David Rydberg is hitting .377, and junior centerfielder Kerry Paprockas is batting .333.

Madonna won't come into the game lacking, however. The Crusaders were 12-4 after taking two of three from Ohio Dominican March 18-19.
